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




E POSTER-MAKING COMPETITION

The Commerce Club of the University organized an E Poster-Making Competition on 22 April 2020 on "COVID 19 and its Impact on the Economy". The activity was an attempt to bring a ray of hope in the darkened times. A good number of entries were registered for the

competition that covered the impact of this global outbreak on various sectors like retail sector, education sector, industrial sector and more. Students rose to the challenge admirably and two teams each secured the top three positions.























ENRICHMENT LECTURE-SERIES – DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

The Department organized a series of virtual Enrichment Lectures to make the most of time during the lockdown-period. The details are as under:

- The first one was held on 23 April 2020 on the topic: The Anthropocene
 in Literature. The speaker for the session was Prof. Krishnan Unni P. of
 the University of Delhi, who introduced the concept of the Anthropocene
 and emphasised the importance of understanding human,
 environmental and global development by reorienting our understanding
 of history and seeing literary works as sources of human interaction with
 the planet.
- The second was a two-part lecture held on 25 and 27 April 2020 with Prof. Pramod K Nayyar, renowned author and academician, from the University of Hyderabad, on 'Travel Writing: An Introduction' and 'The Graphic Novel: An Introduction'. In the former, Prof. Nayar outlined newness, novelty, wonder and exoticism as its core tenets. Covering diverse areas of this theme such as discovery and exploration writings, conquest narratives, anti-conquest travelogues and footsteps travel, he emphasized on how travel also implied not only a communion with other people and cultures but with one's inner self in response to various circumstances.
- In the second part of his Talk, Prof. Nayar began by establishing what the Graphic Novel is, emphasizing on the fact that it is a medium and not a genre. He went on to trace the history of the Graphic Novel and explained how it has evolved into a highly valued literary form, while describing characteristics unique to the Graphic Novel, such as its panel structure, the symbolic nature of fonts used and brought the session to a close with a discussion on the avant garde technique of Graphic Medicine used in medical education and patient care. It was an interesting and informative session.
- The next was on 29 April 2020 on the topic: 'Reading Literature Today and its Continuing Relevance'. The speaker for the event was Prof. Bashabi Fraser from Edinburgh Napier University, Scotland, who began by addressing a probing question about how literature is changing in context with the events of global implications. Using extracts from selected poems as an illustrative backdrop, Prof. Fraser discussed the issues and devastating consequences of climate change and its impact on art, and reflections in literature, specifically in the field of Eco-criticism.
