## 1. Guest Lecture- Constitution and Constitutionalism

The department of Political Science, IIS (deemed to be) University, had organised a guest lecture on constitution and constitutionalism for the students at A.V. Hall on 5<sup>th</sup> February 2020. The speaker of the lecture was Prof. Sudhamohan who is a professor and Head of Department of Civics and Politics, University of Mumbai. Prof. Sudha has decades of experience in teaching courses like Urban Politics in the age of Globalization; Development Discourse; Comparative Politics; New Politics of Identity. She has delivered lectures in various national and international universities as visiting faculty and is recipient of many awards and fellowships.

Dr. Archana Gupta, Head of the Department, introduced the speaker to the students followed by a welcome address.

The speaker began the lecture by explaining the historical perspective of constitution, its meaning, and origin and how it is different from constitutionalism. In her talk she emphasised over the importance and features of an ideal constitution. She cited several incidences from past and documents like Bill of Rights, Megna Carta which strengthen the relevance and effectiveness of laws over absolute monarchs and potential oppressors. She also gave a brief comparison between western and Indian Constitution. The lecture was received with admiration by the students and they also found the slides used by the speaker appropriate and interesting.

Afterward, there was an interactive session, where she invited questions and responded to them in a lively and humorous manner. The session ended with a vote of thanks that was given by Dr. Archana Gupta.

On 25 January 2020, Department of Political Science and NSS students of IIS (deemed to be University) visited the programme organized by State Election Commission, Rajasthan on the occasion of “**Tenth National Voters’ Day**” held at Bhagwant Singh Mehta auditorium. The programme theme was “**Electoral Literacy – Stronger Democracy**”. The purpose of the theme was “Electoral Awareness for a Stronger Democracy”. This initiative is expected to give the youth a sense of citizenship, empowerment and pride. It also aimed “to educate youth about electoral process and encourage them to exercise their franchise.”

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The chief guest for this programme was **Governor of Rajasthan “Sri Kalraj Mishra” and State Election Commissioner “Prem Singh Mehra”** and **Additional Chief Secretary of HCM RIPA Ashwani Bhagat** presided over the function. **Chief Election Officer Mr. Anand Kumar, Divisional Commissioner Mr. K.S. Verma, Jaipur Collector Mr. Jogaa Ram, EC ambassadors and State Icons Mr. Devendra Jhalaria, Mr. Rajat Chauhan, Mr. Vivan Kapoor** were other eminent guests in the programme.

In the beginning of the session, National CEO Sunil Arora speech video was presented. In his address, he congratulated everyone on National Voters’ Day and motivate youth to practice their vote sincerely. Later Rajasthan CEO Mr. Anand Kumar presented the last year’s progress report of State Election Commission and SVEEP campaign. He also discussed the facilities initiated by election commission such as ramp & wheel chairs for specially challenged, awareness forum and mobile app and many more. He specified that the major limitation in accessible electoral is lack of interest in urban voters. So he motivated students to participate in the **Voters’ Awareness Drive**.

**EC ambassador Mr Jhalaria** motivated students to contribute in voters’ awareness program by getting themselves enrolled in voter list and by exercising their franchise. **EC ambassador Mr Rajat Chauhan** emphasis on youth participation and enrollment in voter list.

Mr Syam Sunder Kumawat, student from Mahatma Gandhi BSTC College, delivered his speech in hindi and motivated youth to understand the importance of their vote and practice it sincerely. Ms Gavesha Saraswat, student from the IIS University, expressed her views on the Theme of **Electoral Literacy – Stronger Democracy**. She illustrated about the facilities given by the election commission to make election accessible. She also specified that election accessibility can only be enhanced by absolute involvement of all communities in this process.

Ashok and Anju Rania, students from Dumb and Deaf School, presented a combined speech and expressed their view about youth participation in election process. They motivated youth to actively exercise their duty. Students from IIS School presented a Nukkar Natak to motivate youth to participate in the process with the message “Matdan humara adhika”. Different video clippings on voter awareness were also presented. Electoral Awareness Poster was also inaugurated by the state governor.

On the occasion, **Shri Kalraj Mishra ji** and **Mr Prem Singh Mehra** awarded some first-time voters and the best booth-level officers for bringing the maximum number of people into the voters’ list. First-time voters took an oath with Governor that they will cast their vote and chose the right candidates in the coming elections. He said that despite being highly opinionated and well aware of their rights, people don’t come out to vote. He also discussed the impacts of SVEEP which were Gender gap has been reduced, increased in enrollment and voting percentage. He highlighted the improvement in people involvement in voting process especially in recent municipal elections. And also reported an improvement in enrollment list. He requested people to avoid violence before and after election. **Shri Kalraj Mishra ji** appreciated BPO officers for their rigorous work and youth volunteers for their participation in awareness program. He also appreciated students’ performance in the Nukkard Nattak and laid emphasis on fundamental duties.

In the end, a vote of thanks was presented by Jaipur Collector **Mr Jogaa Ram**. A small exhibition displaying posters about the election process and activities was also set up. It was an inspirational programme. It motivated the student to value their vote and exercise their franchise.


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#### 4. Celebration of Constitution Day

26<sup>th</sup> November 2019

“The Constitution Day” was celebrated by NSS Unit of the IIS (Deemed to be University), Jaipur at the Government Middle School, Sumernagar on 26th November, 2019, to spread awareness about the Indian Constitution and to instill a sense of patriotism among the students. . A special period was taken up by Dr. Archana Gupta, Associate Professor, Department of Political Science, in class VIII<sup>th</sup> and by Ms. Archana Kumari, Programme Officer, NSS, IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur in class V<sup>th</sup>. The meaning of the Constitution, the Preamble, the Five year Plan and the Directive Principle was explained to students in both the classes. In her address she said, “The constitution is the foundation of the country's political system under which its people are governed. Constitution of any State legislature, executive and judiciary wings establishes their powers, the demarcation of their obligations and regulates their relations with the public. Following the class, students of class V<sup>th</sup> to VIII<sup>th</sup> were asked to assemble in the courtyard of school and explained about the significance of the Constitution Day and the importance of being a Sovereign, Socialist, Secular, Democratic and Republic country. Dr. Archana Gupta spoke on the meaning of the Preamble and explained the very philosophy of the Constitution through the meaning of Justice, Liberty, Equality and Fraternity. She highlighted the attainment of Fraternity through Liberty and Equality. The celebration ended with students taking the pledge by reciting The Preamble to the Constitution. 65 students became a part of the event.



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## 5. Guest Lecture- Gandhian Symbolism



On the occasion of 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration of Mahatma Gandhi the Department of History, Political Science and Public Administration jointly organized a Guest lecture on Gandhian Symbolism for the Students of Semester I of B.A, B.A(H) and B.Ed on 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2019. The Guest Speaker on this occasion was Dr. Sangeeta Sharma (Associate Professor, Department of History and Indian Culture & Director, Centre for Rajasthan Studies, University of Rajasthan). Ms. Devyani Singh Rathore introduced the speaker to the audience. Prof Sharad Rathore (Head, Department of History) expressed a token of gratitude to the Dr. Sangeeta Sharma.

In this lecture, **Dr. Sangeeta Sharma** discussed the symbols used by Mahatma Gandhi in the national movement to reach out to the masses. She talked about the difference between the symbol of monarchy and that of Gandhi. She discussed the symbol of salt used by Gandhiji in 1930 Civil Disobedience Movement, The Dandi March saw Gandhiji marching from Sabarmati to Dandi, where he broke the law of making own salt followed by people. This way he was successful in establishing bonds with common masses by using salt as the main symbol because salt was the most common item of consumption by all people rich or poor.

She also said that the Gandhiji used many symbols in the national movement and his most important symbol was Charkha. Khadi and charkha were very popular in Rajasthan too especially in Bijolia movement. Charkha embodied several things: Swadeshi, self-sufficiency and patriotism etc. Later on, charkha was used all across the country as a major symbol of the National Movement. Khadi signified the symbols of sacrifices and simplicity. She also said that the woman's also played an important role in popularizing khadi in the freedom movement in Rajasthan such as

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Ratan Devi Shastri, wife of Hiralal Shastri, who played an important role in Prajamandal movement. However, she also pointed out that fast was also an important symbol of Gandhiji

One old lady was very sad as she was having two three granddaughters and no grandson. Many females were having two-three daughter but they are hoping to have a boy baby in the next delivery. Many females were workers and they shared their feelings that how they are being discriminated by their employer for their wages and leaves. Towards the end some of them realized that they need to change their stereotypical thought regarding gender roles. The activity was ended with a hope that one day they will raise their voice against this shameful act. In the end small refreshments were given to all the participants. i.e. Poha and tea.

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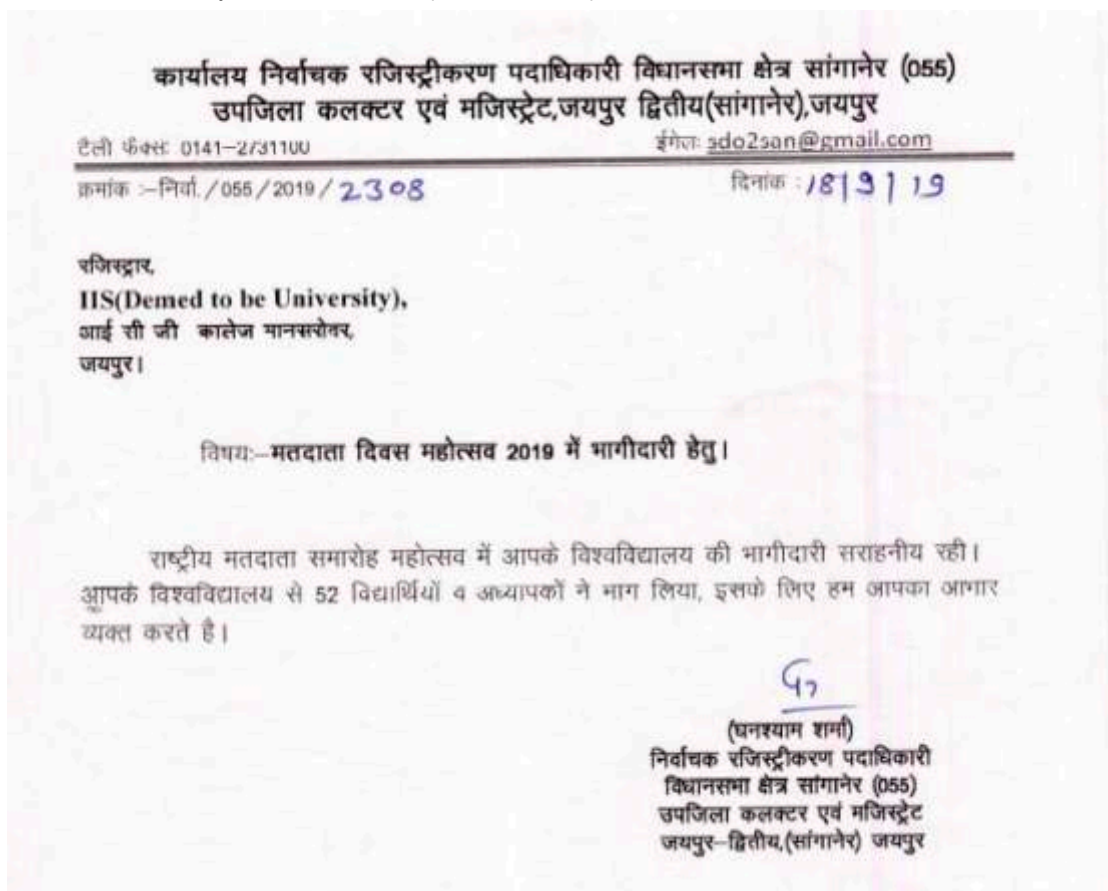

## 3. Students' Seminar on Fundamental Duties in Indian Constitution

Fundamental Duties are the moral responsibilities of all the citizens that need to be performed by them in order to achieve prosperity and uphold the unity of the nation. There has been much talk of the rights of a citizen but the duties are often ignored. Fundamental Duties were incorporated in the Indian Constitution by the 42nd amendment. There are 11 Fundamental Duties for Indian Citizens drafted on the lines of moral, ethical and culture code of conduct followed by people. The duties are educative in nature and direct the citizens to behave in a virtuous and honourable manner.

To celebrate the Constitution Day, a students' Seminar was organised on Fundamental Duties in Indian Constitution. The students presented well researched papers on various issues related to the idea, rationale and application of Fundamental Duties.

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#### 4. Guest Lecture on Right to Education (24.10.2018)

A guest lecture was organized by Department of Home Science on “**Right to Education Act, 2009: Barriers and Challenges**” for the students of M Sc Home Science (HD) and B.Sc H.Sc on 24th October, 2018. The speaker was **Dr. Seema Joshi**, who is presently the Member of Rajasthan State Commission for Protection of Child Rights. She is also the founder of Maulik Foundation which is a NGO working for women and children. She is the member in many organisation including TAABAR which is working for rehabilitation of street children.

She began her lecture with a brief introduction of Rights and why do children need rights. Then she talked in brief about history of RTE Act and its process of coming into existence in 2009. She discussed the recommendations given under different sections of this act regarding infrastructure of the school, teacher-pupil ratio, eligibility criteria for recruitment of teachers and School Management Committee.

After discussing the RTE Act she moved towards its implementation and talked about how this act is being manipulated by school managements. She also discussed about ‘No Detention Policy’ the meaning of which is completely distorted by the teachers. No

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Detention Policy does not mean that child cannot be failed but, it was formulated with the intension of evaluating the child on the basis of CCE (continious Cumulative Evaluation).

But teachers are not skilled enough to carry out CCE in a proper way.

Since she is the member of RTE Act cell of the Rajasthan state commission, she attends workshops conducted to discuss issues and challenges in implementation of the act at the field level. She shared many of her experiences witnessed during the workshops and visit to schools where this act was getting manipulated and distorted especially by private schools.

She mentioned that government is putting their effort to bring all children in school to achieve Universalisation of elementary education. But it can't be possible without participation of parents into education system. Although most of the schools have School Management Committees and parents are recruited as member of the committee but she discussed the reality of these SMCs.

Finally in discussion session students shared their school experiences about corporal punishment which is completely prohibited under RTE Act. Students also asked about the steps taken by the government for connecting curriculum to the real life utilization by including more practical components.



The lecture was ended with an important message that India has many strong policy documents but still the result is negligible because there are manipulations for personal benefits at implementation level. She requested the students to contribute at their own level in changing the present scenario, as they the youth and she believes that only youth has the potential to bring change in the mindset of the society.

#### 5. National Competition on Voting Appeal and made a Short Film on Right to Vote

The department of Journalism and Mass Communication designed a Short Film on creating awareness regarding Voting Rights amongst the citizen of the country. Nearly 20 students from the department under the guidance of Dr. Garima Shrivastava deigned the film. The students developed the script, enacted in the film, recorded it in the department camera and edit the film with the help of the editing software available in the department. 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## 7. Study tour to the Sansad Bhawan and the Rashtrapati Bhawan

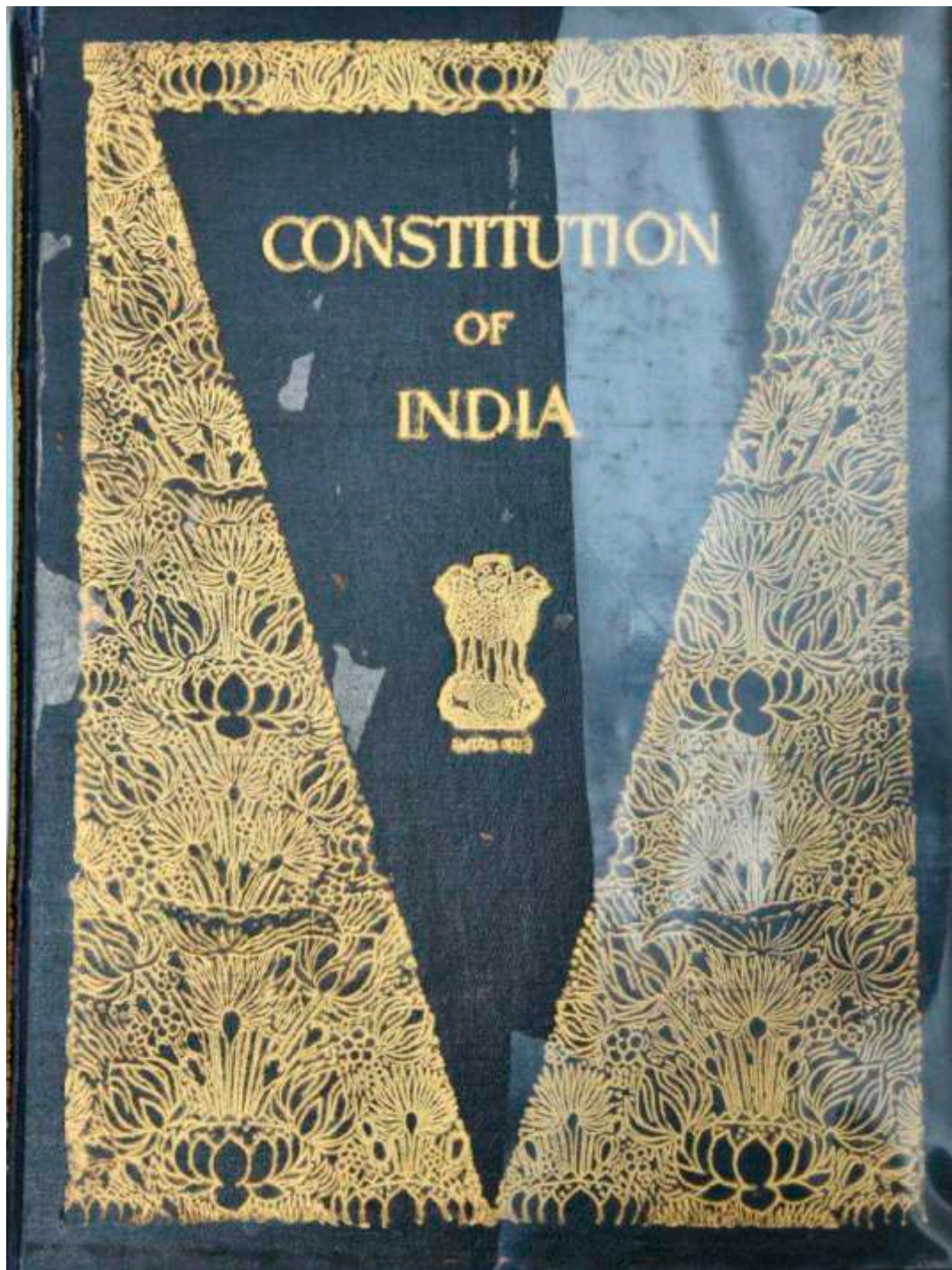
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### 3. The Inside Story of Drafting Constitution

The Guest and Speaker invited for the lecture was Retired Chief Justice of India- Shri S.N. Bhargava ji who happens to be the son of Mr. Mukut Bihari Lal Bhargava, one of the members of the committee constituted for drafting the constitution.**

**Justice Bhargava narrated the story and the various phases in which the constitution was originally drafted. He discussed the issues faced by the committee in drafting the constitution and the way these issues were resolved. He brought the copy of the draft and showed it to students. Students were not just captivated but also motivated to always obey the fundamental duties and practice fundamental rights as mentioned in the constitution.**

#### **4. Movie Screening**

The Department of Political Science organized a movie screening “MAACHIS” on 31<sup>st</sup> August 2017 in AV Hall for all the semester students of BA, BA.B.Ed and BA (Hons.). The movie is based on the perspective on terrorist attack. The title of the film is used as a metaphor that conveys that the youth of any nation are matchsticks that could get ignited due to the deficiencies in the political and policing systems. The film portrays the circumstances surrounding the rise of the Sikh insurgency in Punjab in the 1980s and traces the transformation of youth to a dreaded terrorist.

The movie benefitted the students to understand the separatist demands of Khalistan during 1970s and 1980s and subsequent events and their impact on Indian political scene.


## **6. Voter Awareness Programme**

On 11 July 2017, The IIS University in association with the State Election Commission organized a one-day campaign in the University campus. 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### 3. Pledge Taking Ceremony

Indian Constitution is the supreme law of the land. It gives elaborated framework defining fundamental principles, powers and duties of the governmental institutions and citizens. It establishes constitutional supremacy and was adopted by the Constituent Assembly on 26 November 1949 and came into effect on 26 January 1950. To commemorate this event, 26 November is celebrated as the Constitution Day. The IIS University celebrated the Constitution Day and a series of events was held in this respect.

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## 5. Guest Lecture on 'Addressing Child Rights: Issues and Concerns'



A guest lecture was organized on “**Addressing Child Rights Issues and Concerns**” for the students of M Sc Home Science (HD) and B.Sc H.Sc on 5th October, 2016 by M.Sc H.Sc (Human Development) Department. The speaker was **Ms. Kavita Srivastava**, who is presently the President of the Rajasthan branch of PUCL, a Human Rights national organization. She has worked with Institute of Developmental Studies as an associate fellow in Women studies. She has also been a visiting fellow at IDS SUSSEX, UK. She has been involved in the draft making of many landmark policies such as POCSO, RTI, PWDVA. She has also been nominated for 100 women Nobel Peace Prize and awarded with National Prize for Women Empowerment in 2006.

She talked about the child rights from the women movement approach. The major issue which she addressed was the issue of defining a child in Indian laws. The age of the child in Indian laws varies from one law to another. In many laws such as POCSO, JJ Act, Child Marriage Act the ‘child’ is defined a person below 18 years of age. Even in political context, a person gets the voting right after the age of 18 years in India. But when we come to Child Labor Law, the ‘child’ is defined as any person below 14 years. Furthermore, she explained the consequences at the grass root level in the country. While discussing this major issue of age she also discussed many laws related to child and women in India.

Recent amendment in POCSO, JJ Act, Child Marriage act was discussed by her in brief. She also recommended few changes which should be done in these laws to bring uniformity in legal system dealing with women and children as these laws are interrelated.

Ms Kavita Srivastava also emphasized on the need of awareness of our rights because most of the children and women are not aware of their rights and they are suffering from the problems. She explained that how NGOs working for child rights create awareness in the community and how it delivers the message to the concerned authority from the grass root level.

In the discussion session few students asked about how they can contribute in making the people aware of their rights. In the end, she asked the students to contribute their free time in generating awareness in the community by joining hands with the local NGOs working in the community.

Smt. Suman Sharma started her inaugural speech with gratefulness to be able to speak in a University for first time. She started her term in RSCW with breaking some myths. She studying the dying cases in her files and realized it is not enough to teach girls to break silence. Girls have started going to police station but are unaware of their constitutional rights and the Sections in which they have to report. Because of that ignorance she decided to create awareness among women by organizing legal awareness camps. She expressed that although law is very boring but to create awareness she had to study it. She stressed that girls should know the importance of various sections of 354 of IPC. She shared a booklet that had all women related laws. She informed that the English version of the booklet is under publication.

Dr. Pramila Sanjay, Focal person of UNGCNI, made a lively presentation with the help of PPT about some aspects of the laws and constitutional rights related to women. She emphasized that girls should be aware of good touch and bad touch and should not feel guilty or afraid. They should ensure that FIR should be on green paper, they should read the signed FIR, edit it if required, take a photo immediately and get it printed. There is FIR also for against those not willing to take FIR.

Dr. Raakhi Gupta, Registrar, The IIS University, Jaipur delivered the vote of thanks.

The students of UG and PG participated enthusiastically in the camp and raised several questions related to laws and exercise of their rights.
