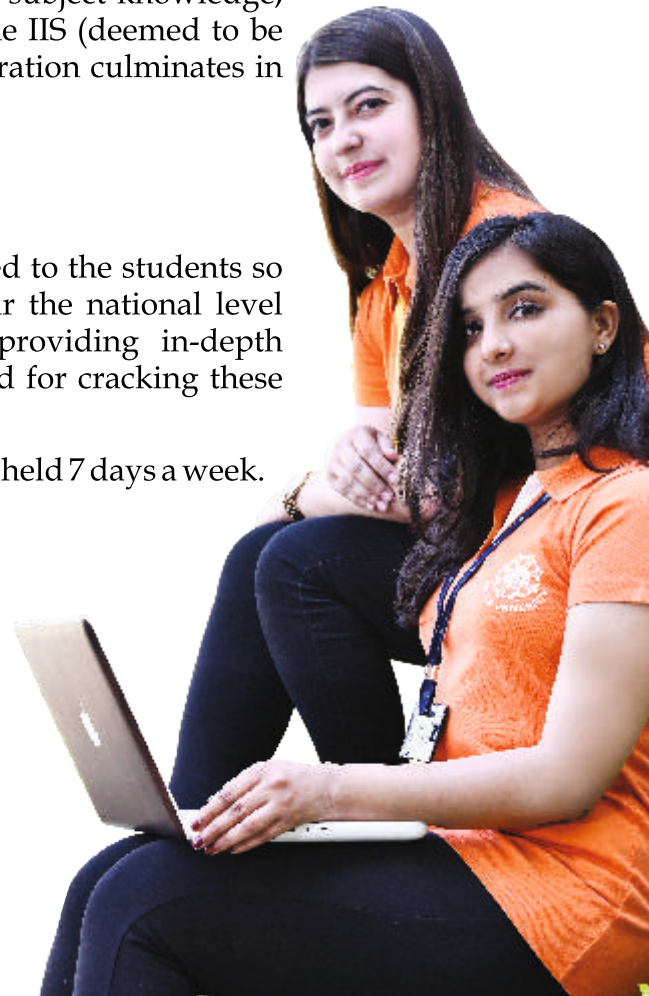
TEACHING METHODOLOGY

UGC-NET JRF

The National Eligibility Test (NET) is conducted on behalf of the University Grants Commission (UGC) for determining the eligibility of Indian nationals for the eligibility of Assistant Professorship, Junior Research Fellowship or both, for Indian Universities and Colleges.

Awarding of Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) and/or eligibility for Assistant Professorship depends on the aggregate performance of the candidate in Paper I and Paper II of UGC-NET.

UGC-NET is conducted twice a year in the month of June and December.

UGC-NET Exam Pattern

UGC-NET Examination shall be conducted as Computer Based Test (CBT) only. The online test will consist of two papers, Both the papers will consist of objective type, multiple-choice questions. There will be no break between the two papers.

Paper	Number of Questions	Marks	Duration
Paper I	50	100	3 hours (180 minutes)
Paper II	100	200	

Note: For each correct response the candidate will get 2 marks but there is no negative marking for incorrect answer.

UGC-NET Syllabus

Paper I : The main objective is to assess the teaching and research capabilities of the candidates. Therefore, the test is aimed at assessing the teaching and general/research aptitude as well as their awareness. They are expected to possess and exhibit cognitive abilities. Cognitive abilities include comprehension, analysis, evaluation, understanding the structure of arguments and deductive and inductive reasoning. The candidates are also expected to have a general awareness and knowledge of sources of information. They should be aware of interaction between people, environment and natural resources and their impact on quality of life. The details are given in the following sections:

Note: Each section gets equal weightage: five questions and 10 marks from each section.

Note: Five questions each carrying 2 marks are to be set from each module.
