- ▶ The manuscript should be prepared in MS Word format, with a length between 4,000–6,000 words, typed in Times New Roman, font size 12, with 1.5 line spacing and standard margins.
- ▶ Referencing should follow the APA style.

ABSTRACT GUIDELINES

- ▶ An abstract of approximately 250 words along with 5 keywords is required.
- ▶ The submission should include a separate title page containing:

Title of the paper | Name(s) of the author(s) | Institutional affiliation(s) | Email ID and contact number of each author
