• Details of the activity

Everyday different careers and professional opportunities are emerging. No matter how much one wants to do all, one will have to prioritize and choose the best option for them. This type of confusion regarding career especially arises in students who have just completed their 10+2 or have completed their Graduation. Since the pool of options and the interests of the students are diversifying, they confront the problem of narrowing down the career of their choice or to plan a long term path to achieve highest position in their fields. Unique strength, weakness, abilities, aspirations and interests help an individual to decide the option for them.

The entire processes of career planning at the Counselling and Career Development Centre (CCDC) are ideally done in conjunction with the counsellor, so that individual has professional help at every step. Career counselling at the University helps the students to choose the career option and the appropriate course to their aptitude, identifying the values, aspiration and goals and scope of the course that one is pursuing or planning to pursue in India or Abroad.

To provide career counselling and vocational guidance to the student, the centre conducts various psychometric tests like:

- 1. Interest Test
- 2. Aptitude Test
- 3. Personality Test

These tests help the students to take an informed decision about their field of study.

The centre believes that emotional well-being is the key to a contended, fulfilling life. Our aim is to bring our clients to a wholeness of mind, body and spirit. Mental and emotional distress covers many different kinds of unhappiness. Each person is different and so one person's distress will be unique from other. Many people feel uncomfortable with the idea of mental health problems and emotional difficulty. It may be hard to talk to family or friends about how they feel. The competition and the peer relationship can impact the students in a way, inappropriate for their mental well-being. Sometimes, the work life can build up stress in the individual which can imbalance their personal-professional equilibrium point. Thus, the faculty and students seek help for their problems.

In this context, The Counselling and Career Development Centre (CCDC) help the students and faculty by giving them a confidential, safe and regular place to think and talk about their difficult experiences and feelings. We all have valuable internal resources to call upon, but sometimes we are unable to make use of them without the help of an understanding counsellor.

To provide emotional and behavioral counselling to the students on one to one bases, proper sessions are planned so that they can tackle the difficult situations when they occur in future again. Skills are developed to make them strong decision taker and see their present situation in a more clear way.




Summary/Description:

The Counselling and Career Development Cell – IIS (deemed to be University) organized 15 days Internship for the 4 students enrolled in Advanced Diploma in Counselling and Guidance in the month of March. The internship started with a basic orientation programme where the students were briefed about what career counseling and testing is and what it would entail. The students were first required to administer the tests for Interest, Personality and Aptitude on themselves so as to gain better understanding of those tests. The students were then assigned clients, with whom they built rapport and administered tests. Each student had to work on clients for Psychometric Testing and Doubt reports individually. They were also trained in the scoring and interpretation of the test responses. The students learnt how to prepare reports by taking all the dimensions into considerations. The students prepared their client's report. They also observed how the reports were presented and explained to the clients. Students also prepared doubt reports and its importance and functions were explained.

Outcome of the activity:

- The students got hands-on exposure of administering tests(Interest, Personality and Aptitude)
- The students learned the importance of record maintaining.






Summary/Description:
