#### THE IIS UNIVERSITY : WHERE UNIQUE IS A TRADITION

The IIS University (IISU) is an exceptionally cosmopolitan and vibrant university based in one of the country's most exciting and ethnically rich cities - The Pink City. It is known for excellence in student centered learning and is dedicated and unequally qualified to prepare the students to become the World's next generation of creative leadership.

Amongst the thirty eight deemed to be universities in India placed in the category 'A' by Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, it is a progressive institution that has blazed trails since its inception in 1995 as the International College for Girls (ICG).

The journey since then has been marked with accolades and recognitions all the way. As ICG, it has been accredited **A+ by the NAAC of UGC**, recognized as a **College with potential for excellence (CPE) by the UGC**, selected as a model College and centre of excellence by the State Government and conferred with the status of Autonomous College by the UGC. In a national survey by AC-Nielsen-ORG –MARG for the India Today Magazine, ICG was rated as the top college in the state in Arts, Science and Commerce streams and ranked among the top 30 institutions of the country for several years prior to becoming Deeme to be a University. Within a short span of being granted an autonomous status by UGC in 2007, the college was declared a deemed to be a university in 2009 in the name and style of The IIS University, by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India under section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956. The IIS University has been accredited by the NAAC and included u/s 12B by UGC. It under went a successful review of its Deemed to be a University status by a peer team of UGC in October 2016. The University has been granted the membership of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) and The Association of Common wealth Universities, U.K. (ACU), which is the world's oldest international University network.

At IISU, career education is imparted within the framework of thorough general education in the faculties of Arts, Social Sciences, Commerce, Management, Visual Arts, Science & Home Science. With about 5200 students and 305 staff members, the University offers a wide array of Semester based UG, PG and Research programmes which make for a robust academic environment. Besides the regular courses of study on offer, the University makes available a wide range of application based subjects. It has also taken a lead in introducing vocational and job oriented courses designed to develop the much needed competencies which would help the students to keep pace with the times. As a leading centre of higher studies, the University has taken an initiative in implementing innovative pattern of research based on UGC regulations 2009, now upgraded to UGC Regulations 2016. One distinguishing feature of IISU is a basket of 36 Career Oriented and Skill Development (COSD) Programmes. A student can choose any of these COSD courses across the discipline and faculty. In addition to their degrees the candidates are awarded Certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma on successful completion of First/Second/Third levels respectively of these programmes. The University also provides ample opportunties to students to participate, perform and excel in games and sports, cultural and extra curricular activities, outreach programmes, fashion shows etc. The University, as a member of AIU, has been hosting All India West Zone Women Tournaments for the last three years.

As a deemed university it has the freedom to:

- establish courses of study and research and to provide instruction in such branches of study as it may deem appropriate for the advancement of learning and dissemination of knowledge
- to confer degrees and to grant diplomas and / or certificates to persons who have satisfactorily completed the approved courses of study and / or research as may be prescribed and shall have passed the prescribed examinations
- determine and prescribe its own courses of study and syllabi and to restructure and redesign the courses to suit local needs
- evolve methods of assessment of students performance, to conduct examinations and to declare results
- use modern tools of educational technology in order to achieve greater creativity and excellence in higher education
- promote healthy practices such as community services, extension activities and projects for the benefit of the society
- institute and award visitorship, fellowship, exhibits, prizes and medals

#### **GOVERNANCE OF THE IIS UNIVERSITY**

The following statutory bodies have been constituted, as per the guidelines of University Grants Commission and notifications issued by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India from time to time and provisions in the MOA/Rules of The IIS University framed as per UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations 2010 and updated in the light of UGC Regulations, 2016 to oversee its administrative, academic, cocurricular and financial aspects :

In addition to the above mentioned Statutory Bodies, certain committees such as Deans Committee, Research Advisory Committees (in place of DRCs), Departmental Research Admission Committees (DRACs), IQAC, Grievance Appeal Committee, Examination Committee, Admission Committee, Student Welfare Committee, Committee for Co-curricular Activities, Standing Committee, Grievance Redressal Committee, Unfair Means Adjudication Committee, Result Committee, Library Committee and Academic Audit Committee, P.T.A., to name a few, have been constituted and strengthened to streamline various activities of the deemed university.

#### **PATTERN OF COURSES**

The courses offered by the IISU, leading to undergraduate, postgraduate, M.Phil. and Ph.D. degrees, are semester based. There are two semesters in a year. The first semester called Autumn Semester or Odd Semester commences in the second week of July and continues till the second week of December. The second semester called Spring or Even Semester commences in the third week of December and continues till about the third week of May followed by Summer vacations. Each semester is of about 20 weeks duration inclusive of Teaching Work, CA Tests and Semester End Examinations. On the other hand, the MBA programme offered by the faculty of Management Studies at The IIS University is trimester based, where each academic year is divided into three trimesters, each trimester of about 15 weeks duration, inclusive of Teaching Work, Continuous Assessment and Trimester End Examination besides professional training of one month during summer vacations.

Besides regular UG and PG programmes, the University also offers professional courses at UG & PG levels, Career Oriented and Skill Development Courses, Short Term Modular Courses and PG Diplomas. In all the regular undergraduate programmes, with the exception of B.Com. Honours (Proficiency in Chartered Accounting / Proficiency in Company Secretaryship), all the first year students (Semester I & II) are required to compulsorily opt for any one Career Oriented and Skill Development Course (leading to certificate or diploma) as per UGC scheme of pursuing one Certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma programme along with the regular degree programme. In the subsequent years joining a Diploma/Advanced Diploma programme is optional.

The professional and Honours Courses in some of the disciplines are being offered on Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) pattern, recommended by the UGC.

#### (B) International Tests of English offered by the University of Cambridge, UK : Business English Certificates (BEC)

Offered by the University of Cambridge, ESOL (English for the Speakers of Other Languages), UK, BEC is a suite of international examinations (Preliminary, Vantage and Higher), which assesses the Business English proficiency of the candidate. Through regular classes by trained faculty, the University prepares its students for BEC qualification which is recognised by institutions and multinational corporations worldwide.

#### (C) CISCO-Certification Programme

The University has collaborated with CISCO in establishing a Networking Academy on campus to run the CISCO-Certified Network Associate (CCNA) Course in three schemes. This programme enhances the ability of students to design, build, install and maintain routed LAN and also solve network and engineering problems.

#### (D) Programme through EDUSAT

EDUSAT, India's first exclusive educational satellite, is intended to meet the demand for an interactive satellitebased distance education system for the country. The Department of Geography at the University, in collaboration with IIRS, Dehradun-ISRO under the EDUSAT Distance Learning Programme, offers Short Term Certificate Courses on Remote Sensing, GIS(Geographical Information System), GPS (Global Positioning System), Natural Resource Management and Geo-Web Services. Students also get an opportunity to interact frequently with senior professionals in this field.

#### Eligibility

For admission to B.A., B.Com., B.Sc. Pass Course and B.Sc. (Hons.) Home Sc., the minimum qualification for a student is a Senior School Examination Certificate (Class 12) from any recognised or accredited Board of Education in India or abroad.

For other UG courses like B.V.A., B.B.A., B.C.A., B.A. Honours, B.Com. Honours, B.Sc. Honours, B.Sc. Fashion Design, B.Sc. Jewellery Design & Technology, B.A. (J.M.C.), B.Com. Honours, (Professional), minimum eligibility is a Senior School Examination Certificate (Class 12) from any recognised or accredited Board of Education in India or abroad with minimum 48% in the aggregate, or any grade equivalent to the same, provided that a relaxation of 5% in minimum eligibility marks is permissible to SC/ST/OBC candidates and a relaxation of 3% in minimum eligibility marks is also provided to physically handicapped candidates, subject to production of relevant certificate from a competent authority.

#### Weightage (any one)

Weightage as given hereunder is provided to the eligible candidates while computing their relative merit. Different types of weightage are not cumulative; instead, a candidate is provided maximum weightage out of the categories for which she is eligible.

- 2% weightage is given to students of India International School seeking admission to undergraduate courses.
- 2% weightage is given to candidates who have represented the district or the state in games and sports, on production of original certificates.
- 2% weightage is given to candidates who have successfully completed at least two years' training in NCC/ NSS/Scouting at Secondary / Senior Secondary level, on production of the original certificates.
- International players may be considered for outright admission irrespective of their place in the merit list.

Separate merit lists are prepared for different categories of candidates and admissions are made in order of merit, observing reservation of seats as per the policy of the Central Government in this regard.

\*Admission to MBA (trimester/co-educational) will be granted on the basis of the scores of CAT/ MAT or any other All-India Entrance Exam followed by a GD and PI and to MBA (semester scheme / only for girls) will be granted on the basis of the aggregate of the marks obtained at graduation and the score obtained in PI. Candidates fulfilling the above eligibility criteria will be granted admission on the basis of merit.

A relaxation of 5% in minimum eligibility marks is permissible to SC/ST/OBC (non creamy layer) candidates and a relaxation of 3% in minimum eligibility marks will also be provided to the differently-abled (PWD-Person with Disability) candidates, subject to the producing of a relevant certificate from a competent authority. The definition of creamy layer is decided by the State Government from time to time (under the OBC category). Separate merit lists will be prepared for different categories of candidates and admissions made in the order of merit, observing reservation of seats as per the policy of the Central Government in this regard.

For Honours students, the percentage of marks obtained at the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Honours Examination as a whole (marks obtained in the Honours subject as well as the Subsidiary subject(s)) will be taken into consideration.

#### Weightage (any one)

Weightage, as given hereunder, is provided to the eligible candidates while computing their relative merit. Different types of weightage are not cumulative; instead, a candidate is provided maximum weightage out of the categories for which he/she is eligible.

- 5% weightage will be given to the B.A. (H), B.Sc. (H) and B.Com. (H) students seeking admission to a P.G. course in that subject.
- 2% weightage will be given to graduates of the IIS University seeking admission to any of the P.G. courses.
- 2% weightage will be given to those candidates who have played a game or sport at the District or State or National level.
- 2% weightage will be given to the students who have successfully completed two years' training in NCC/NSS at the Undergraduate level, on production of the original certificates.
- International players may be considered for outright admission irrespective of their place in the merit list.

An MBA is thus a career-accelerator across a number of industries. It is available in the following streams :

#### MBA 02 Family Business and Entrepreneurship (Co-educational Trimester Programme)\*

Our country has always had a large number of traditional family businesses that have been running successfully for generations. These family businesses have grown over the years and are now competing with the corporates. The increased number of start-ups by today's youth has further accentuated the need to bring in professional processes and practices in business. Realizing these challenges of the millennium generation, MBA in Family Business and Entrepreneurship has been designed with the objective of inculcating a habit of independent thinking and communicating ideas without hesitation, so as to groom students into becoming competent managers, enthusiastic entrepreneurs and skilled business people with a global mindset and a strong foundation of core human values.

The course is targetted towards two distinct audiences:

- (a) Young graduates with no prior experience in business but who exhibit entrepreneurial ambitions

#### MBA - Semester Programme (Only for Girls)

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#### **REGULATIONS (CREDIT SYSTEM AND EXAMINATION)**

#### 1. CREDIT SYSTEM

The courses at The IIS University are based on credit system. Each course is assigned credits depending on the quantum of work required in each semester. The formula for assigning credits to a course is based on the number of contact hours per week and time involved in preparation/self study by the students is as shown below:

The credit system has been introduced in all the semester based UG and PG courses and course work for Ph.D. and M.Phil. programes. Trimester based courses are also credit based, where 30 contact hours/trimester (or 3 contact hours/week) is assigned 2 credits for theory and similarly credits are decided for other modes of pedagogy. Career Oriented Skill Development programmes which are based on the annual pattern are also assigned credits on similar pattern.

#### 1.1 Credit System for B.A. / B.Sc. Pass Course, B.A.-B.Ed./B.Sc.-B.Ed. Integrated Programmes The credit pattern of an elective in the pass course may have one of the following profiles as given in Table 7.

Unless otherwise specified, each paper is examined through Continuous Assessment (C.A.) and Semester-End Examination (S.E.E.) or Trimester-End-Examinations (T.E.E.), as the case may be. Credits are awarded when a candidate passes both the C.A. and S.E.E./T.E.E. in a paper separately.

### **REGULATIONS (Academic/Examinations for courses other than CBCS)**

### 2. STUDENT ENROLLMENT

Those students admitted to Semester I of the regular Undergraduate / Postgraduate degree programmes, PG diploma programmes or Trimester I of MBA programme or First Year of any other programme conducted by the University and students seeking lateral admission (not admitted in any regular programme) in COSD (Certificate, Diploma or Advanced Diploma) programmes are enrolled with the IIS (deemed to be University). Students passing their qualifying examination from any Board or University other than the IIS (deemed to be University) or ICG (Autonomous) are required to submit the migration certificate from their earlier Board/University **along with a self attested copy of their Aadhar Card**. The admission of such students is confirmed only after their eligibility is decided by the university. For the purpose of enrollment, the qualifying examination passed from a Board estblished by the Central Govt. or State Govt. or from a University approved by the UGC u/s 2f, a deemed University established under section 3 of UGC Act, 1956 or a member University of AIU shall be considered valid. For others, the equivalence of examination/degree shall be decided as per the rules of the University.

### 3. RESEARCH ENTRANCE TEST

The admission to M.Phil./Ph.D. Programmes is given through Research Entrance Test (RET) conducted by the University in the month of July. RET is conducted online and is based on the pattern of Multiple Choice Questions. The syllabi for RET are as prescribed by the UGC for NET, however, in the subjects in which NET is not conducted, the University has framed its own syllabi. Candidates with M.Phil. degree and those who have qualified a National level examation like NET/SET etc. are exempted from the requiement of RET. The candidates seeking admission in M.Phil/Ph.D. are also required to appear before Departmental Research Admission Committee (DRAC) for personal interview. The admissions are given on the basis of merit computed from the score in RET, Academic Record and Personal Interview, with relative weightages as mentioned in the IISU M.Phil./Ph.D. Bye laws, subject to availability of seats.

### 4. REGISTRATION FOR M.Phil. AND Ph.D. PROGRAMMES

As per the specifications given in the M.Phil./Ph.D. Bye laws of the IIS (deemed to be University), a candidate is registered for M.Phil. or Ph.D. programme only after she has successfully completed the course work, and her research proposal is approved by her Research Advisory Committee (RAC). Even if a candidate is exempted from the requirement of course work (on the basis of having done the same in M.Phil.), approval of the research proposal by the RAC is the mandatory requirement to consider her case for registration to M.Phil./Ph.D. programme.

### 5. EXAMINATION FORMS AND EXAMINATION FEE

All the students are required to fill up examination forms online for each Semester / Trimester examination as per the schedule announced by the University. The duly filled in examination forms should be deposited by the candidates along with the prescribed examination fee.

### 6. UNIT BASED SYLLABI

The syllabi of all the papers included in various programmes are divided into 5 units, with the number of lecture hours required to cover each unit specified against each unit. Each question paper of the Semester/Trimester-End Examination is set to cover the entire syllabus.

### 7. EVALUATION SYSTEM

Evaluation for Semester/Trimester based programmes is done through Continuous Assessment (CA) and Semester/ Trimester-End Examination (SEE/TEE). The relative weightage for the two types of evaluation is as given below, unless otherwise specified in the curriculum :

At the end of each semester, the marks awarded in different components of CA and the consolidated CA marks are shown to the students by the respective teachers or alternatively the CA marks statements are displayed on the departmental notice boards for verification by the students. Posting errors, if any, can be brought to the notice of the teacher concerned who takes necessary action to correct any mistake found to be genuine. After verification by the students, the marks are entered in the "Continuous Assessment Booklet" (Yellow Booklet) which the students are required to sign. The CA marks are also posted on the metacampus and the students are required to submit an OK report.

### 7.5 Semester/Trimester/Year-End Examinations

The Semester/Trimester/Year-End Examinations are held at the end of each semester / trimester / year as per the examination schedule issued by the University.

### 7.6 Pattern of Question Paper for Semester/Trimester/Year-End Examinations

The question papers of Semester / Trimester / Year-End Examinations contain various types of questions like objective type- multiple choice questions, short answer type questions, problems, case studies, numericals, descriptive questions and application based questions covering the entire syllabi.

### 7.7 Online Tests

For the foundation courses like Our Environment, Environmental Conservation, Computer Applications, General Studies, Women's Studies, Entrepreneurship and Management etc. and the Ability Enhancement Courses under CBCS like Environmental Science, CA tests as well as Semester-End Examinations are conducted online.

### 7.8 Coding of Answer Books

For assessment of Semester / Trimester / Year-End Examination answer books, a system of coding is followed wherein each answer book is given a fictitious roll number to ensure fair and just evaluation.

### 7.9 Evaluation of Answer Books

In the Semester / Trimester / Year-End Examination, each answer book is evaluated by two examiners. The average of marks awarded by the two examiners is taken as the marks obtained by the candidate. In case the difference between the two awards is more than 20%, the answer book is sent for evaluation to a third examiner and the average of the two closest awards out of three is taken as the final marks obtained by the candidate.

### 7.10 Scrutiny of Answer Copies and Marks

To ensure that no answer is left unassessed and to eliminate any calculation or posting error by the examiner, each answer copy is scrutinized.

### 7.11 Evaluation of Practicals

The Semester/Trimester/Year-End Practical Examinations are conducted by a panel of internal and external examiners. The students are examined and awarded marks in the practicals as per the scheme of examination mentioned in the syllabi of the respective subjects.

### 7.12 Evaluation of Project/Seminar

The evaluation of projects and seminars is based on the written reports, presentation and viva-voce and is done by a panel of experts including internal and external examiners.

### 7.13 Evaluation of Career Oriented and Skill Development Courses

These courses follow an annual pattern of examination which comprises Continuous Assessment and the Year-End Examination with the relative weightage of 30% and 70% respectively. The pattern for CA in these courses is similar to that of UG pass course in the semester scheme, as mentioned in section 7.1**[Table 105 & 106(a & b)]** 

### 7.14 Grievances of the Students

Grievances of the students regarding question papers, if any, should be received within three days of the date of exam. The grievances are then put up before the **Grievance Redressal Committee**, which submits its recommendations after taking opinion of subject expert(s). Final decision is taken by the Vice-Chancellor on the recommendations of the committee.

In programmes other than M.Phil. and Ph.D., in order to pass in a paper, a candidate must secure minimum pass marks individually in C.A. and Semester-End Examination (S.E.E.) (annual exam in case of COSD and Trimester-

End-Examination in case of MBA Programme-trimester scheme) of that paper. A candidate is deemed to have failed in a C.A. and / or S.E.E. or T.E.E. or Annual Examination of a theory paper/practical/project/seminar, etc. if the above mentioned conditions are not fulfilled.

A candidate is considered to have passed in a semester end / trimester end or annual examination of a course if she/he has passed all the CA and SEE /TEE or Annual Examinations of theory papers / practicals / projects / seminars etc., prescribed in the curriculum of that particular semester / trimester/year.

In M.Phil./ Ph.D. programme, a candidate is required to obtain the minimum pass marks in the aggregate total of C.A. and S.E.E. in each paper.

### 9 AWARD OF CREDITS

Credit means a unit by which the course work is measured. It defines the quantum of content in the syllabus prescribed for a course and also the relative weightage of different courses in a programme. It also determines the number of hours of instruction and the effort required to be put in by the student for learning the course. Credits assigned to a paper are awarded to a candidate on passing the C.A. and Trimester/Semester -End-Examination or Annual Examination of that paper, as the case may be, in examinations other than M.Phil. and Ph.D. In case of M.Phil./Ph.D. programme, credits assigned to a paper are awarded to the candidate, if she obtains minimum pass marks in the aggregate of C.A. and S.E.E. marks.

### 10 PATTERN OF EVALUATION/ RESULT COMPUTATION

The performance of candidates seeking admission in Semester/Trimester I of UG/PG programmes in the academic session 2018-19 and the courses run under CBCS will be measured on the basis of **Grading System**. However, the performance of candidates already enrolled with the University i.e. students of semesters III, IV, V, VI of different UG and PG programmes and semesters VII & VIII (BVA) & Trimesters IV, V & VI (MBA Trimester Scheme), will continue to be measured in terms of **Credit Weighted Average**.

### 10.1 Grading System (For students seeking admission in Semester/Trimester I)

The assessment of the candidate is done on the basis of **Absolute Grading System**, wherein the performance of the candidate, in a course in a Semester/ Trimester, is first measured in terms of marks in Continuous Assessment and Semester/ Trimester End Examination and then the total marks obtained by the candidate in a course out of hundred are converted into Letter Grades (viz. O, A+, A, B+, B, C, P and F).

- **10.1.1** The **Semester/TrimesterGrade Point Average (SGPA/TGPA)** is worked out on the basis of grades earned by the candidate and credits assigned to different courses. The SGPA/TGPA in a Semester/Trimester is determined only when the candidate has passed all the examinations of theory papers, Practicals, Projects, Seminars, and any other component of the course, as prescribed in the syllabi and has earned the required minimum credits. However, the result of the candidate is declared only when he/she earns the required credits for Extra Curricular and Campus Activities (applicable on UG programmes only). The performance of the candidates in COSD courses are not considered for computation of SGPA, the same is separately evaluated for award of Certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma.
- **10.1.2** Similarly, **Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)** is worked out up to a particular semester/ trimester or for the complete programme when the candidate has qualified all the courses prescribed upto that semester/trimester or in the complete programme by passing in all the examinations of theory papers, practicals, projects, dissertations, seminars and any other type of courses prescribed in the programme and has earned the required credits up to that particular semester/ trimester or for the complete programme, as the case may be.
- **10.1.3** For COSD Programmes which are of annual pattern, **Yearly Grade Point Average (YGPA)** is calculated taking into consideration the marks obtained in C.A. and Annual examination of all the theory papers, practicals, projects, seminar etc. and field work, summer training etc., if any. It is mandatory to pass individually in CA and Year End Examination for the award of credits. The candidates qualifying all the examinations in all the courses prescribed

in the COSD programme in the first year are awarded 'Certificate'; whereas the candidates continuing the COSD Programme for the second and third year and qualifying all the examinations are respectively awarded the 'Diploma' and 'Advanced Diploma' in the respective COSD programme

- **10.1.4 Grade Point** is the numerical weight allotted to each letter grade depending on the system of grading adopted by a university. The IIS University follows a 10-point grading system, wherein the marks obtained by a student in a particular course are converted into Letter Grades (O, A+, A....F). These grades carry numerical weights called Grade Points such as 10, 9, 8....0. The criteria for awarding Grade Points and Letter Grades are illustrated in Tables 111, 112 & 113.
- **10.1.5** Credit Points refer to the product of "Number of credits assigned to a course" and "the grade point secured by a student for the said course."
- **10.1.6** Grade Point Average (GPA) is an index for comparing relative performance of the students in a course and is worked out by using the following formula:

$$\mathsf{GPA} = \frac{\Sigma(\mathsf{Credits} \times \mathsf{Grade Points})}{\Sigma \, \mathsf{Credits}} = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^{n} C_{i} G_{i}}{\sum_{i=1}^{n} C_{i}}$$

(up to a particular semester/ trimesteror for the entire programme)

where i refers to a course in a semester/ trimester,  $C_i$  stands for the credits allotted to i<sup>th</sup> course and  $G_i$  are the grade points earned by the student in i<sup>th</sup> course and therefore  $C_iG_i$ = credit points in the i<sup>th</sup> course.

**10.1.7** "Semester/ Trimester / Yearly Grade Point Average" (SGPA/ TGPA/ YGPA): SGPA/TGPA/ YGPA is an index to measure a student's performance in a given semester/ trimester/ year. It also provides a comparison between the performances of different students in a class.

It is defined as the ratio of the "total credit points earned by the student in all the courses in a semester/ trimester/ year" and the "total number of credits assigned to all the courses" in the said semester/ trimester/ year.

$$SGPA/TGPA/YGPA = \frac{\sum \text{Credits X Grade points}}{\sum \text{Credits}} = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^{n} C_i G_i}{\sum_{i=1}^{n} C_i}$$

where i refers to a course in a Semester/Trimester/ year,  $C_i$  stands for the credits allotted to i<sup>th</sup> course and  $G_i$  are the grade points earned by the student in i<sup>th</sup> course and  $C_i G_i$  = credit points in the i<sup>th</sup> course. The SGPA/TGPA/YGPA is expressed upto two decimal places. However, the credits assigned to the extra curricular activities and campus activities are not taken into account while working out SGPA/TGPA/YGPA.

## COSD Programmes are separately evaluated on Annual basis for the award of Certificate / Diploma / Advanced Diploma.

**Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):** CGPA refers to the 'Cumulative Grade Point Average' determined up to a particular semester/ trimester(i.e., for the 2<sup>nd</sup>semester/ trimester and thereafter) and/ or for the complete programme. It is the ratio of the sum of credit points earned by a student up to a particular semester/ trimester(or for the entire programme) and the sum of the total credits up to that semester/ trimester(or for the entire programme).

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum \text{Credits X Grade points}}{\sum \text{Credits}} = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^{m} C_{i}G_{j}}{\sum_{j=1}^{m} C_{j}}$$

(up to a particular semester/ trimester or for the entire programme)

where j refers to the j<sup>th</sup> course, C<sub>j</sub> is the credits allotted to the j<sup>th</sup> course and G<sub>j</sub> represents the grade points obtained by the student in j<sup>th</sup> course.

The CGPA for the complete programme can also be worked out from SGPA/ TGPA of different semester/ trimester by using the formula

 $CGPA = \frac{Sum of (Credits \times SGPA obtained in each Semester / Trimester)}{2}$ 

### Sum of Credits in All Semesters / Trimesters

or

$$\mathsf{CGPA} = \frac{\Sigma_{i=1}^{n} S_{i}}{n}$$

where n refers to the total number of Semesters/ Trimesters in the programme and S<sub>i</sub> is the SGPA/ TGPA in i<sup>th</sup> semester/ trimester.

### 10.1.8 LETTER GRADES AND GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR AWARD OF GRADES:

As per the recommendation of the U.G.C., a 10 point grading system with the following letter grades and grade points (as given in Table 111, 112 & 113.) has been adopted. Other grades to be awarded in special circumstances are also indicated in the table.

A brief description of the significance of letter grades given in the above table is as follows:

- (i) Eight letter grades: O, A<sup>+</sup>, A, B<sup>+</sup>, B, C, P and F are related to assessment of performance of the students, that have grade points with values distributed from 10 to 0 on a 10 point scale, as given in Tables 111, 112 & 113.
- (ii) A student obtaining grade 'F' in a course is considered to have failed in that course. Such courses in which the candidate obtains 'F' grade are treated as 'Due Papers' and the candidate is required to reappear in the subsequent examinations to pass the due paper.
- (iii) Grade 'UM' is awarded to a candidate, whose case is reported for using unfair means. Subject to the decision in the matter on the basis of recommendations of Unfair means Adjudication Committee, grade 'UM' is converted into 'F' grade or other letter grade, as the case may be. The candidate can re-appear in the examination for converting grade 'F' in to other letter grade, only after the period of ban on taking examination, if any, as may be imposed by the U.M. Adjudication Committee, is over.
- (iv) A candidate appearing in an examination for converting grades like 'F', 'AB' or 'UM' into other letter grade, shall not be awarded a grade higher than 'A', even though he/she might have obtained higher marks than 'A' grade in the examination.
- (v) 'I' grade refers to an 'incomplete' grade, which is required to be converted in to a letter grade. A student may be awarded 'I' grade in a course if he/she has missed the Semester/ Trimester/ Year End Examination on account of being deputed by the university to participate in an inter-university/state level competition/ tournament or National/ International event. A special examination is conducted for such students with special permission of the Vice Chancellor. An 'I' grade is converted to a letter grade soon after the result of special examination of such a candidate is available.
- (vi) For co-curricular activities or any such other component of the programme, 'S' (satisfactory) or 'U' (unsatisfactory) grade shall be awarded depending on the performance of the candidate and this will not be counted for computation of SGPA/ TGPA/ YGPA/ CGPA.
- (vii) A. The minimum passing percentage in U.G Honours / Professional courses/ COSD Programmes and CBCS based courses is 40% individually in C.A. and Semester//Trimester/Year End Examination. The minimum passing grade (P) in a course shall therefore be awarded to a candidate if she obtains at least 40% marks, individually in C.A. and S.E.E/ T.E.E./Year End Exam (Y.E.E). and also in the aggregate total of C.A. and S.E.E./T.E.E./Y.E.E.
  - **B.** The minimum passing percentage in U.G Pass Course and PG Non Professional Programmes is 36% individually in C.A. and Semester End Examination. The minimum passing grade (P) in a course shall therefore be awarded to a candidate if she obtains at least 36% marks, individually in C.A. and S.E.E. and also in the aggregate total of C.A. and S.E.E.
  - **C.** The minimum passing percentage in M.Phil./ Ph.D. Programmes is 55% in the aggregate total of C.A. and S.E.E. The minimum passing grade (P) in a course shall therefore be awarded to a candidate if she obtains at least 55% marks in the aggregate total of C.A. and S.E.E.
- (viii) The grades are awarded after applying the Grace as per university regulations in this regard. The grace marks are added to the marks obtained by the candidate for the purpose of awarding grade, whereas actual marks are shown

on the grade sheet and the grace is indicated by putting a 'G' against the marks in the course (s)/paper(s) in which grace is given. The details of grace marks awarded is shown in the footnote on the grade sheet.

- (ix) The grace marks can be awarded only in theory papers and will be limited to 1% of the total of maximum marks allotted to all the papers in the programme in a semester/ trimester/ Year. Co-curricular activities, COSD courses shall not be counted for this purpose. Grace will not be awarded in practicals, projects, seminar, dissertation, field work, summer training etc.
- (x) Separate grade sheets will be issued to the students for their performance in the examinations of 'Certificate', 'Diploma', and 'Advanced Diploma' taken by them as 'Add-on' courses.

### 10.1.9 OVER ALL GRADING

The overall grading in a Semester/Trimester/Year is awarded on the basis of SGPA/TGPA/YGPA. Similarly, the overall grading up to a particular semester/trimester (i.e., for 2<sup>nd</sup> semester/trimester and thereafter) or for the complete programme is awarded on the basis of CGPA. For this purpose the criteria to be followed is as given below in Tables 114, 115 & 116, depending on the programme opted by the student:

## 10.2 Credit Weighted Average (CWA)for Semesters III, IV, V, VI of UG and PG programmes and VII & VIII (BVA) & Trimesters IV, V &VI (MBA Trimester Scheme)

Credit weighted average (CWA) is worked out for each semester or trimester as well as for the complete course. When worked out for a Semester, it is called 'Semester Credit Weighted Average' (SCWA), for a Trimester, it is called 'Trimester Credit Weighted Average' (TCWA) and for the complete course, it is called 'Cumulative Credit Weighted Average' (CCWA). CCWA is worked out only when the candidate has passed all the examinations of theory papers, practicals, projects, seminars, core papers, foundation papers and any other components of the course, as prescribed in the syllabi and has earned the required minimum credits along with the credits prescribed for the Extra Curricular and Campus Activities.

CWA is an index for comparing relative performance of the students in a course and is worked out by using the following formula:

where  $\Sigma$  represents summation over the theory/practical papers, project, seminar etc., to which credits are assigned. However, the credits assigned to the extra curricular activities and campus activities are not taken into account while working out CWA.

SCWA is awarded separately for foundation courses and electives (including core courses) in the UG pass and professional courses. Similarly in an Honours programme, SCWA is awarded separately for the foundation courses and the major and subsidiary papers taken together. In the P.G. programmes, MBA and M.Phil. / Ph.D. (course work), all the theory papers, practicals, project, dissertation, seminar etc. are taken into consideration while working out SCWA.

Similarly in MBA Programmes following trimester scheme, for working out TCWA all the papers, practicals, projects, seminars etc. prescribed in a trimester are considered and all the papers, practicals, projects, seminars etc. prescribed for the entire programme are considered for working out CCWA.

For COSD Programmes which are of annual pattern, over all percentage is calculated taking into consideration the marks obtained in all the theory papers, practicals, projects, field work, summer training etc. It is mandatory to pass individually in CA and Year End Examination.

### 10.2.1 AWARD OF CLASS / DIVISION

Class / Division is awarded separately in the foundation courses and electives (including core courses, if any) in UG pass and professional courses. Similarly, in an honours programme, separate class/division is awarded for foundation courses and major and subsidiary papers taken together. In P.G. & M.B.A. Programmes, and in COSD courses all the components of study are taken into consideration for the award of class/division.

### 11. DECLARATION OF RESULT

The results are declared by the Controller of Examinations, after being approved by the Result Committee. The roll numbers of successful candidates are displayed on the notice boards and the website. The details of marks/ grades obtained by the students are also made available on the University website. The result committee may also decide to moderate any result/ grades whenever such a need arises.

### 12. MIGRATION AND PROVISIONAL CERTIFICATES

For students enrolled with IIS (deemed to be University), the Migration and Provisional Certificates are issued by IIS (deemed to be University).

### 13. CONSOLIDATED MARK SHEETS/ TRANSCRIPTS

On successful completion of a programme, a consolidated mark sheet/ transcript is issued by the IIS (deemed to be University),, showing the marks/ grades obtained, credits earned in different semesters / trimesters throughout the programme, CCWA/CGPA, and class /division or overall grade, as the case may be, obtained by the candidate. For candidates admitted in the courses under CBCS consolidated grade sheet will be issued on the completion of the programme.

### 14. AWARD OF DEGREES

All students admitted under IIS (deemed to be University), on successful completion of their course/programme will be awarded degrees by IIS (deemed to be University).

### 15. MERIT POSITIONS

IIS (deemed to be University), declares merit positions from amongst the successful candidates who have obtained SCWA/ TCWA/ YCWA of more than 60 individually in all semesters/trimesters/annual examinations (or obtained overall Grade 'A' or above in all the semesters/ trimesters and also overall Grade 'A' in the final examination (cumulative score) in the programmes under CBCS and other programmes where grading system is applicable. They should have secured atleast First division in the final examination (cumulative score) and have passed all the prescribed papers in a course / programme in the first attempt along with the batch. For this purpose being absent in a paper is considered as attempt availed. The number of merit positions declared in different programmes is based on number of students in a programme. If the number is 50 and above, upto 10 merit positions may be declared. If the number is less than 50 but more than 10 then upto 5 merit positions may be declared. However, if the number is less than 10, upto 3 positions may be declared, provided that number of positions to be declared will not exceed 50% of the total strength in the programme.

### 16. ATTENDANCE

For being eligible to appear in the Semester / Trimester-End Examination, it is necessary for a candidate to have attended a minimum of 75% of the total classes held in that Semester / Trimester. There is a provision of duty leaves for participation in games and sports, NCC/NSS, cultural and other co-curricular / extra curricular or academic activities so as to enable the participants to fulfill the minimum requirement of attendance.

### 17. RULES FOR PROMOTION

In semester based programmes (including CBCS), the students admitted to odd semesters (I, III, V or VII at UG level or I/III at PG level) of all programmes, except M.Phil. and Ph.D., are automatically promoted to the next semester irrespective of their result in these semesters. Thus there is no check on promotion from an odd semester to the next even semester. However, at the end of an even semester, the year long performance of a candidate is taken into account for promotion to the next odd semester. Similarly in M.B.A. (Trimester Scheme) programme a candidate is automatically promoted from trimester I to II and II to III. However, for promotion to IV trimester his / her performance in I, II and III trimesters, taken together, is considered.

### 17.1. Promotion in U.G. Pass Course

At the UG (pass course) level, the performance of a candidate in only three electives is taken into consideration for the purpose of promotion to the next semester. Total credits assigned to the three electives / core courses in a semester are 3 x 8 =24. Therefore, out of a total of 48 credits assigned to the electives in the two semesters (I and II), a candidate must earn at least 20 credits for promotion to the next semester (i.e., semester III). Similarly for promotion to Semesters. The credits earned in the foundation courses, extracurricular activities and campus activities are not considered for the purpose of promotion. However, for the award of degree, it is necessary that a candidate must qualify and earn minimum required credits in the foundation courses, the extra curricular activities and campus activities and campus activities, failing which the degree is not awarded.

### 17.2 Promotion in U.G. Honours Programmes

In an Honours programme, major subject carries 16 credits and the subsidiary subject 8 credits, which totals to 24 credits in a semester. Thus out of 48 credits assigned to the major and subsidiary in two semesters (I & II or III & IV), a candidate must earn at least 20 credits in the two semesters, taken together, for promotion to the next higher semester. The credits of foundation courses, extracurricular activities and campus activities are not taken into account for the purpose of promotion. However, for the award of degree, it is necessary that a candidate must qualify and earn minimum required credits in the foundation courses, extracurricular activities and campus activities, failing which the degree is not awarded.

### 17.3 Promotion in P.G. Courses

In PG courses, a candidate must earn at least 50% of the total credits assigned to the papers prescribed in the first and second semesters, taken together, for promotion to the third semester. The credits of extracurricular activities (if any) and campus activities are not taken into account for the purpose of promotion.

### 17.4 **Promotion in Professional Courses**

In professional courses like B.Sc. Jewellery Design & Technology, B.Sc. Textiles, B.V.A., M.V.A., M.S.W., M.A.(J.M.C), M.Sc. Textiles, MBA-I.B., MBA-H.R.M., MBA-M.M., MBA-R.M., MBA-T.T.M. and MCA and any other professional programme, a candidate must earn at least 50% of the total credits assigned to the preceding two semesters (i.e., semesters I & II/ III & IV/ V & VI) for promotion to the next odd semester (i.e. III/V/VII semester). Credits assigned to the foundation courses, extracurricular activities and campus activities are not considered for the purpose of promotion. However, for the award of degree, it is necessary that a candidate must qualify and earn minimum required credits in the foundation courses, extracurricular activities and campus activities, failing which the degree is not awarded.

### 17.5 Promotion in M.B.A. Programme (Trimester Scheme)

An M.B.A. student must earn atleast 50% of the total credits assigned to the papers prescribed in the I, II & III trimesters taken together for promotion to the IV trimester. The credits of extracurricular activities (if any) and campus activities are not taken into account for the purpose of promotion.

### 17.6 Promotion in M.Phil. & Ph.D. Programmes

A candidate admitted to M.Phil. / Ph.D. programme can be registered for the respective degree only after he/she qualifies all the papers prescribed in the course work and approval of the Research Proposal by his/her RAC. There is no provision of automatic promotion (or Registration for M.Phil./Ph.D. degree) without passing the course work and approval of the research proposal by the RAC.

### 17.7 Provision for Unsuccessful Candidates

A candidate who is not eligible for promotion to the Semester III or V or VII or trimester IV, as the case may be, is allowed to appear in the subsequent examinations as an ex-student so as to qualify more papers and earn more credits in the immediately following year or in a Special Examination conducted by the university in July for students failing in practicals/ projects/ internship/ viva voce and C.A. component and/or not more than 50% of theory papers. After fulfilling the necessary criterion for promotion, such students are re-admitted and promoted to the next semester / trimester, as and when the relevant semester / trimester course is being run by the University.

### 18. DUE PAPERS

If a student does not pass in all the courses/papers prescribed in a semester / trimester, but he / she earns the minimum credits required for promotion, he / she is promoted to the next semester / trimester and the papers in which he / she has failed are treated as "due papers". The candidate is required to appear in the due papers along with the papers of the next semester / trimester, provided that the examination of the due papers of an odd semester is held in an odd semester only and the examination of the due papers of an even semester is held in an even semester only. Similarly in M.B.A. (trimester scheme) programme the due papers of trimesters I, II & III are held with the exams. of trimesters IV, V & VI respectively. In M.Phil. and Ph.D. programmes, a candidate is allowed three attempts to clear the due papers and pass the course work.

In case of due papers, if a candidate fails in Semester / trimester-End Examination only, the CA marks obtained by him / her in those papers in the earlier semester(s) / trimester(s) are taken into account and the candidate is re-examined only in the Semester/Trimester-End Examination. However, if a candidate fails in CA, he / she is required to appear in CA of the due papers also.

Similar provision as above, also apply to programmes under CBCS.

Similarly, in Career Oriented and Skill Development (Certificate / Diploma / Advanced Diploma) courses, a candidate failing in not more than 50% of the total papers (considering C.A. & S.E. as separate papers) may take the same as due papers in the immediately following year.

### 19. DUE PAPER EXAMS FOR FINAL YEAR STUDENTS

In the semester system, a candidate is allowed to take her due papers along with the papers of the next semester. Hence, there is no provision for any supplementary examination. However, due paper(s) examination is also held for the final year students of UG & PG in the month of March for clearing the due papers of odd semesters (I, III, V) and in the month of July for clearing the due papers of even semesters (II, IV, VI) and remaining due papers of Semester I, III & V, if any.

Similar provision as above, also apply to programmes under CBCS.

In M.B.A. (trimester scheme) programme, a special examination is conducted for I to III trimesters after declaration of results of T.E.E. of III trimester and also for IV to VI trimesters after declaration of result of VI trimester, in which candidates may clear their due papers of any trimester.

Due paper(s) examination is also conducted for M.Phil./Ph.D. candidates, permitting them a maximum of three attempts to clear the due papers.

### 20. IMPROVEMENT

The students of PG programmes are permitted to improve their performance in a maximum of 50% of the theory papers in the immediately following year. In such cases, CA marks already earned by a candidate in the previous year are taken into consideration. The candidates are allowed to sit in the Semester-End Examination for improvement of first semester papers along with her papers of the third semester and for second semester papers alongwith her papers of fourth semester. Similarly for improvement in the papers of third and fourth semesters one can appear in the odd and even semester examinations respectively in the immediately following year. The new marks are taken into consideration only if he/she improves his/her performance. No such provision for improvement of performance exists for UG, M.Phil., Ph.D., M.B.A., Professional courses and COSD programmes.

### 21. MAXIMUM TIME LIMIT

IIS (deemed to be University) provides flexibility of time limit for different courses. Starting from the time of admission, the time limit for different programmes is as given below :

- i) UG pass course- 10 semesters (5 years)
- ii) Honours Programmes 10 semesters (5 years)
- iii) UG level Professional courses- 10 semesters (5 years)
- (B.C.A., B.B.A., B.Sc.-Fashion Technology etc.)
- iv) B.V.A.- 12 semesters (6 years)
- v) PG Programmes 8 semesters (4 years)
- vi) M.B.A. (trimester scheme)-12 trimesters (4 years)

- vii) M.B.A. (semester scheme) Programmes 8 semesters (4 years)
- viii) M.Phil./Ph.D.

### As per the M.Phil./Ph.D. Bylaws of IIS (deemed to be University)

### NOTE

- 1. Ordinarily, no student shall be given time beyond the maximum time limit shown above (i.e. minimum period of the programme plus two years). However, in exceptional circumstances and on the basis of the merits of each case, the Vice Chancellor may allow a student one/two more semester(s) for completion of the programme.
- 2. During the extended period the student shall be considered as a private candidate and also not be eligible for ranking.
- 3. These provisions do not apply to M.Phil. and Ph.D. programmes, where maximum span is governed by the M.Phil./Ph.D. Bye laws of IIS (deemed to be University).

### 22. SHOWING ANSWER COPIES OF SEE/TEE/ANNUAL EXAMINATIONS

There is a provision of showing assessed answer copies of Semester/Trimester End Examination/Annual Examination to the students of the University for which they are required to apply by depositing a duly filled form and the requisite fee within a period of 7 days of declaration of results.. The copy is shown to the applicant in the presence of a teacher. In case any answer is found un-assessed or there is an error in totaling of marks the examination cell puts up the case of the applicant in the committee constituted for this purpose. Necessary action on the recommendation of the committee is taken by the examination cell after the approval of the Vice Chancellor. There is no provision for revaluation of answer books. It should be noted that the University retains the Answer Scripts for only one year after declaration of the result. The University may hold the result of candidates who fail to earn minimum required credits in the activity component. In such cases, answer book can be shown only after declaration of result when the credits of activity are earned by the candidate.

### 23. UNFAIR MEANS CASES

If a candidate is found using unfair means or indulging in disorderly conduct during the CA tests or Semester / Trimester-End Examination or annual examination, a case of unfair means is registered against him / her and placed before the Unfair Means Adjudication Committee, constituted by the Academic Council. The committee examines the cases with the help of subject experts and recommends suitable action to the Vice-Chancellor for a final decision in the matter.

### 24. WITHHOLDING OF RESULT

The University reserves the right to withhold the result of all those candidates who have not been enrolled in IIS (deemed to be University) for valid reason like non submission of T.C., Migration Certificate, Aadhar Number or Marksheet of last qualifying examination.

### 25. PROVISIONS FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

The University has special provisions for the assessment and evaluation of persons with disabilities, as per the guide lines issued by the Ministry of Social Justice and empowerment, in this regard.

### 26. CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

IIS (deemed to be University) is known for taking lead in introducing academic and administrative reforms in order to make teaching-learning process a world class experience. It implemented Semester Scheme, Credit Based Curricula and Continuous Assessment almost a decade back. In continuation of this trend, the University introduced Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), Continuous Assessment and Grading Pattern (CAGP) in the year 2016-2017. This is an internationally acknowledged system and **recommended by the UGC** for all the Universities and Institutions of Higher learning. The CBCS is student centric, where students can exercise options to select courses of their choice from the discipline and also across the discipline. It offers opportunities and avenues to learn and explore additional avenues of learning beyond the core subjects for holistic development of students. It is being implemented at the University in a phased manner. In the first phase, beginning from the academic session 2016-17, most of the professional programmes being offered at Under Graduation level have adopted CBCS and CAGP.

### 26.1 Advantages of the choice based credit system:

- From the teacher-centric to student-centric education
- Student may undertake courses of as many credits as they can cope with (not required to repeat all courses in a given semester if they fail in one/more courses).
- CBCS allows students to choose inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary courses, skill oriented papers (even from other disciplines according to their learning needs, interests and aptitude) and provides more flexibility to students).
- CBCS makes education broad-based and on par with global standards. One can take credits by selecting unique combinations. For example, Physics with Economics, Microbiology with Chemistry or Environment Science with Statistics etc.
- CBCS offers flexibility to students for studying at different times, different pace and at different institutions to complete one course (easy mobility of students from one institution to the other).
- Credits earned at one institution can be transferred to other.

### 26.2 Outline of Choice Based Credit System

- **Semester System**: It involves clear cut identification of duration of teacher learner engagement and duration for conduct of assessment and term end examination for evaluation and certification by declaration of grades. As per UGC regulations each academic session is divided in two semesters of 90 days each.
- **Cafeteria Approach**: It aims to accommodate student preferences and create a flexible higher education model by providing choices to students within an institution as well as 'seamless mobility across institutions' in India and abroad. Students can take courses of their choice, learn at their pace, undertake additional courses, earn more than required credits, adopt interdisciplinary approach to learning
- Credit system: Under the CBCS, the requirement for awarding a degree or diploma or certificate is prescribed in terms of number of credits to be completed by the students. A Credit represents a unit by which the course work is measured. It defines the quantum of contents of the syllabus prescribed for a course and also the relative weightage of different courses in a programme. It also determines the number of hours of instructions and student effort required to be put in for proper learning of the course. On an average: 1 credit=15 hrs of lectures/ tutorials +15 hrs of student efforts or 30 hrs of practical work/ field work + 15 hrs of student effort.

### 26.3 Types of Papers/ Courses under CBCS

- **Core Course**: A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as the core requirement of the programme is termed as a Core course.
- Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
  - **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course**: Elective courses that may be offered by the main discipline/ subject of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Electives. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of applied or interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/ subject of study).
  - **Dissertation/Project :** An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as a project or supplement study/support study to a project work, and such a course which a candidate studies on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.
  - **Generic Elective (GE) Course**: An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/ subject, with an intention to seek exposure or to broaden the horizons of knowledge of the discipline is called a Generic Elective.

**Note:** A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/ subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Electives.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to basic Knowledge or communication skill enhancement, such as Environmental Science and English / MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and /or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

- Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication/ MIL Communication.
- Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge.
- 26.4 Research Component in UnderGraduate Courses: Project work/Dissertation is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving / analyzing /exploring a real life situation / difficult problem. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

# 29. EXAMINATION SCHEME AND PATTERN OF EVALUATION IN PROGRAMMES UNDER CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

### 29.1 STUDENT ENROLLMENT

Students admitted to Semester I of a programme under CBCS offered by the University are enrolled with IIS (deemed to be University). Students passing their qualifying examination from any Board or University other than IIS (deemed to be University) or ICG (Autonomous) are required to submit the migration certificate from their earlier Board/University **along with a self attested copy of their Aadhar Card**. The admission of such students is confirmed only after their eligibility is decided by the university. For the purpose of enrollment, the qualifying examination passed from a Board estblished by the Central Govt. or State Govt. or from a University approved by the UGC u/s 2f, a deemed University established under section 3 of UGC Act, 1956 or a member University of AIU shall be considered valid. For others, the equivalence of examination/degree shall be decided as per the rules of the University.

### 29.2. EXAMINATION FORMS AND EXAMINATION FEE

All the students admitted to programmes under CBCS are required to fill up examination forms for each semester examination as per the schedule announced by the University. The duly filled in examination forms should be deposited by the candidates along with the prescribed examination fee.

### 29.3. UNIT BASED SYLLABI

The syllabi of all types of courses prescribed in various programmes under CBCSare divided into 5 units, with the number of lecture hours required to cover each unit specified against each unit. Each question paper of the Semester–End Examination is set to cover the entire syllabus.

### 29.4. EVALUATION SYSTEM

Evaluation for Semester based programmes under CBCS is done through Continuous Assessment (CA) and Semester-End Examination (SEE). The relative weightage for the two types of evaluation is as given below, unless otherwise specified in the curriculum:

The evaluation for the C.A. is internal and for the S.E.E., it is external (unless otherwise specified in the syllabus). The above mentioned pattern is uniformly applicable to all under-graduate pass course/ honours / professional programmes under CBCS.. The annual examination for the Career Oriented and Skill Development courses is also conducted on the same pattern.

### 29.5 Continuous Assessment for U.G. Level Honours & Professional Programmes under CBCS

For UG Honours / Professional Programmes under CBCS, the CA in theory papers is based on one test, one home assignment, class-room activity and attendance; the relative weightage of which is as shown below:

The CA marks for the Projects/Field Work and Seminars are awarded on the basis of written reports, presentation and/or viva-voce examination of the students.

### 29.6 CA Test Papers

The CA test papers for UG Honours / Professional Programmes under CBCS include:

- a) Short answer type questions, problems based on case studies, numericals etc.
- b) Descriptive questions

The duly assessed test answer sheets are returned to the students. The students can register their grievances, if any, with the teacher concerned, who takes appropriate action to resolve the matter.

### 29.7 Verification of CA Marks

At the end of each semester, the marks awarded in different components of CA and the consolidated CA marks are shown to the students by the respective teachers or alternatively the CA marks statements may be displayed on the departmental notice boards for verification by the students. Posting errors, if any, can be brought to the notice of the teacher concerned who takes necessary action to correct any mistake found to be genuine. After verification by the students, the marks are entered in the "Continuous Assessment Booklet" (Yellow Booklet) which the students are required to sign. Alternatively, C.A. marks of students may be hosted on Metacampus for the information of students. After resolving student grievances if any, the record of C.A. marks on Metacampus is finalised for result compilation.

### 29.8 Semester/ Year-End Examinations

The Semester/ Year-End Examinations are held at the end of each semester / year, as per the examination schedule issued by the University.

### 29.9 Pattern of Question Paper for Semester/ Year-End Examinations

The question papers of Semester / Year-End Examinations contain various types of questions like objective type / multiple choice questions, short answer type questions, problems, case studies, numericals, descriptive questions and application based questions covering the entire syllabi.

### 29.10 Online Tests

For programmes under CBCS, the CA test as well as semester-end examination of Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) on 'Environmental Science' are conducted online, based on random selection of questions from the digital question bank maintained by the University.

### 29.11 Coding of Answer Books

For assessment of Semester / Year-End Examination answer books, a system of coding is followed wherein each answer book is given a fictitious roll number to ensure fair and just evaluation.

### 29.12 Evaluation of Answer Books

In the Semester / Year-End Examination, each answer book is evaluated by two examiners. The average of marks awarded by the two examiners is taken as the marks obtained by the candidate. In case the difference between the two awards is more than 20%, the answer book is sent for evaluation to a third examiner and the average of the two closest awards out of three is taken as the final marks obtained by the candidate.

### 29.13 Scrutiny of Answer copies and Marks

To ensure that no answer is left unassessed and to eliminate any calculation or posting errors by the examiner each answer copy is scrutinized.

### 29.14 Evaluation of Practicals

The Semester / Year-End Practical Examinations are conducted by a panel of internal and external examiners. The students are examined and awarded marks in the practicals as per the scheme of examination mentioned in the syllabi of the respective subjects.

### 29.15 Evaluation of Project/Seminar

The evaluation of projects and seminars is based on the written reports, presentation and viva-voce and is done by a panel of experts including internal and external examiners.

### 29.16 Evaluation of Career Oriented and Skill Development Courses

These courses follow an annual pattern of examination which comprises Continuous Assessment and the Year-End Examination with the relative weightage of 30% and 70% respectively. The pattern for CA in these courses is similar to that of UG Honours/ Professional Programmes under CBCS, as mentioned in clause 29.5. **(Table 122-124)** 

### 29.17 Grievances of the Students

Grievances of the students regarding question papers, if any, should be submitted in the Examination Cell within three days of the date of the conduction of exam. The grievances are put up before the Grievance Redressal Committee which submits its recommendations after taking opinion of subject expert(s). Final decision is taken by the Vice-Chancellor on the recommendations of the committee.

In order to pass in a paper, a candidate must secure minimum pass marks individually in C.A. and Semester-End Examination (S.E.E.) (annual exam in case of COSD) of that paper. A candidate is deemed to have failed in a C.A. and / or S.E.E. or Annual Examination of a theory paper/practical/project/seminar, etc. if the above conditions are not fulfilled.

A candidate is considered to have passed in a semester end / annual examination of a course if she/he has passed all the CA and SEE or Annual Examination of theory papers / practicals / projects / seminars etc., prescribed in the curriculum of that particular semester / year.

### 29.19 AWARD OF CREDITS

**Credit** means a unit by which the course work is measured. It defines the quantum of content of the syllabus prescribed for a course and also the relative weightage of different courses in a programme. It also determines the number of hours of instruction and the effort required to be put in by the student for learning the course. Credits assigned to a paper are awarded to a candidate on passing the C.A. and Semester -End-Examination or Annual Examination of that paper, as the case may be.

### 30 Grading System

The performance of the candidates is measured on the basis of **Absolute Grading System**, wherein the performance of the candidate in a course in a semester is first measured in terms of marks awarded through Continuous Assessment and Semester End Examination and then the total marks obtained by the candidate in a course out of hundred are converted into Letter Grades (viz. O, A+, A, B+, B, C, P and F)

- **30.1** The **Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)** is worked out on the basis of grades earned by the candidate and credits assigned to different courses. The SGPA in a semester is determined only when the candidate has passed all the examinations of theory papers (i.e., Ability Enhancement Papers, Core Papers, Generic Electives, Discipline Specific Electives and Skill Enhancement Papers), Practicals, Projects, Seminars, and any other component of the course, as prescribed in the syllabi and has earned the required minimum credits. However, the result of the candidate is declared only when he/she earns the required credits for Extra Curricular and Campus Activities. The performance of the candidate in COSD courses are not considered for computation of SGPA, the same is separately evaluated for award of Certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma.
- **30.2** Similarly, **Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)** is worked out up to a particular semester or for the complete programme when the candidate has qualified all the courses prescribed upto that semester or in the complete programme by passing in all the examinations of theory papers, practicals, projects, dissertations, seminars and any other type of courses prescribed in the programme and has earned the required credits up to that particular semester or for the complete programme, as the case may be.
- **30.3** For COSD Programmes which follow annual pattern, **Yearly Grade Point Average (YGPA)** is calculated taking into consideration the marks obtained in C.A. and Annual examination of all the theory papers, practicals, projects, seminar etc. and field work, summer training etc., if any. It is mandatory to pass individually in CA and Year End Examination for the award of credits. The candidates qualifying all the examinations in all the courses prescribed in the COSD programme in the first year are awarded 'Certificate'; whereas the candidates continuing the COSD Programme for the second and third year and qualifying all the examinations are respectively awarded the 'Diploma' and 'Advanced Diploma' in the respective COSD programme.
- **30.4 Grade Point** is the numerical weight allotted to each letter grade depending on the system of grading adopted by a university. The IIS University follows a 10-point grading system, wherein the marks obtained by a student in a particular course are converted into Letter Grades (O, A+, A....F). These grades carry numerical weights called Grade Points such as 10, 9, 8....0. The criteria for awarding Grade Points and Letter Grades are illustrated in Table 126.
- **30.5 Credit Points** refer to the product of "Number of credits assigned to a course" and "the grade point secured by a student for the said course."
- **30.6** Grade Point Average (GPA) is an index for comparing relative performance of the students in a course and is worked out by using the following formula:

$$\mathsf{GPA} = \frac{\Sigma(\mathsf{Credits} \times \mathsf{Grade Points})}{\Sigma \,\mathsf{Credits}} = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^{n} C_{i}G_{i}}{\sum_{i=1}^{n} C_{i}}$$

where i refers to a course in a semester,  $C_i$  stands for the credits allotted to i<sup>th</sup> course and  $G_i$  are the grade points earned by the student in i<sup>th</sup> course and  $C_i G_i$  = credit points in the i<sup>th</sup> course.

**30.7** "Semester Grade Point Average" (SGPA): SGPA is an index to measure a student's performance in a given semester. It also provides a comparison between the performances of different students in a class.

It is defined as the ratio of the "total credit points earned by the student in all the courses in a semester" and the "total number of credits assigned to all the courses" in the said semester.

$$SGPA = \frac{\sum \text{Credits X Grade points}}{\sum \text{Credits}} = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^{n} C_i G_i}{\sum_{i=1}^{n} C_i}$$

where i refers to a course in a semester,  $C_i$  stands for the credits allotted to i<sup>th</sup> course and  $G_i$  represents the grade point earned by the student in i<sup>th</sup> course and  $C_i G_i$  = credit points in the i<sup>th</sup> course. The SGPA is expressed upto two decimal places. However, the credits assigned to the extra curricular activities and campus activities are not taken into account while working out SGPA. Also the performance of the student in COSD is not taken into consideration for computing the SGPA. COSD is separately evaluated on yearly basis for the award of Certificate / Diploma / Advanced Diploma.

**Cumulative grade point Average (CGPA):** CGPA refers to the 'Cumulative Grade Point Average' determined up to a particular Semester (i.e., for the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester and thereafter) and/ or for the complete programme. It is the ratio of the sum of credit points earned by a student up to a particular Semester (or for the entire programme) and the sum of the total credits up to that Semester (or for the entire programme).

$$CGPA = \frac{\Sigma(Credits \times Grade Points)}{\Sigma Credits} = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^{m} C_{j}G_{j}}{\sum_{i=1}^{m} C_{j}}$$

(up to a particular semester/trimester or for the entire programme)

where j refers to the j<sup>th</sup> course, C<sub>j</sub> is the credits allotted to the j<sup>th</sup> course and G<sub>j</sub> represents the grade points obtained by the student in j<sup>th</sup> course.

The CGPA for the complete programme can also be worked out from SGPA of different Semesters by using the formula

or

$$CGPA = \frac{Sum of (Credits \times SGPA obtained in each Semester)}{Sum of Credits in all Semesters}$$

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^{n} S_{i}}{n}$$

where n refers to the total number of Semesters in the programme and S<sub>i</sub> is the SGPA in i<sup>th</sup> semester.

### 30.8. LETTER GRADES AND GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR AWARD OF GRADES:

As per the recommendation of the U.G.C., a 10 point grading system with the following letter grades and grade points (as given in Table 126.) has been adopted. Other grades to be awarded in special circumstances are also indicated in the table.

A brief description of the significance of letter grades given in the above table is as follows:

- (i) Eight letter grades: O, A<sup>+</sup>, A, B<sup>+</sup>, B, C, P and F are related to assessment of performance of the students, that have grade points with values distributed from 10 to 0 on a 10 point scale, as given in Table 126.
- (ii) A student obtaining grade 'F' in a course is considered to have failed in that course. Such courses in which the candidate obtains 'F' grade are treated as 'Due Papers' and the candidate is required to reappear in the subsequent examinations to pass the due papers.
- (iii) Grade 'UM' is awarded to a candidate, whose case is reported for using unfair means. Subject to the decision in the matter on the basis of recommendations of Unfair Means Adjudication Committee, grade 'UM' is converted into 'F' grade or other letter grade, as the case may be. The candidate can re-appear in the examination for converting grade 'F' in to other letter grade, only after the period of ban on taking examination, if any, as may be imposed by the U.M. Adjudication Committee, is over.

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   (iv) A candidate appearing in an examination for converting grades like 'F', 'Ab' or 'UM' into other letter grade, shall not be awarded a grade higher than 'A', even though he/she might have obtained higher marks than 'A' grade in the examination.
- (v) 'l' grade refers to an 'incomplete' grade, which is required to be converted in to a letter grade. A student may be awarded 'l' grade in a course if he/she has missed the Semester/Year End Examination on account of being deputed by the university to participate in an interuniversity/state level or National/International event. A special examination is conducted for such students with special permission of the Vice Chancellor. An 'l' grade is converted to a letter grade soon after the result of special examination of such a candidate is available.
- (vi) For co-curricular activities or any such other component of the programme, 'S' (satisfactory) or 'U' (unsatisfactory) gradesare awarded depending on the performance of the candidate and this is not to be counted for computation of SGPA/CGPA.
- (vii) The minimum passing percentage in U.G Honours / Professional courses/ COSD Programmes is 40% individually in C.A. and Semester/Year End Examination. The minimum passing grade (P) in a course shall therefore be awarded to a candidate if she obtains at least 40% marks, individually in C.A. and S.E.E/ Year End Exam (YEE). and also in the aggregate total of C.A. and S.E.E./ YEE.
- (viii) The grades are awarded after applying the Grace as per university regulations in this regard. The grace marks are added to the marks obtained by the candidate for the purpose of awarding grade, whereas actual marks are shown on the grade sheet and the grace is indicated by putting a 'G' against the marks in the course (s)/paper(s) in which grace is given. The details of grace marks awarded will be shown in the footnote on the grade sheet.
- (ix) The grace marks can be awarded only in theory papers and will be limited to 1% of the total of maximum marks allotted to all the papers in the programme in a semester/Year. Co-curricular activities, COSD courses are not be counted for this purpose. Grace will not be awarded in practicals, projects, seminar, dissertation, field work, summer training etc.
- (x) Separate grade sheets will be issued to the students for their performance in the examinations of 'Certificate', 'Diploma', and 'Advanced Diploma' taken by them as 'Add-on' courses.

### 30.9 OVER ALL GRADING

The overall grading in a Semester/Year is awarded on the basis of SGPA/YGPA. Similarly the overall grading up to a particular semester (i.e., for 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester and thereafter) or for the complete programme is awarded on the basis of CGPA. For this purpose the criteria to be followed is as given below in Table 127:

### 31. DECLARATION OF RESULTS

The results are declared by the Controller of Examinations, after being approved by the Result Committee. The result committee may also decide to moderate any result whenever such a need arises. The roll numbers of successful candidates are displayed on the notice boards and the website. The details of marks obtained by the students are also made available on the University website and also on the Metacampus or the digilockers of the students.

### 32. MIGRATION AND PROVISIONAL CERTIFICATES

The Migration and Provisional Certificates are issued to its students by the IIS (deemed to be University).

### 33. TRANSCRIPTS/ CONSOLIDATED MARK SHEETS

On successful completion of a programme, a Transcript/ consolidated mark sheet is issued by the IIS (deemed to be University), showing the grades/ marks obtained, credits earned in different semesters throughout the programme.

SGPA earned in different semesters and CGPA, along with overall grade obtained by the candidate, in the complete programme.

### 34. AWARD OF DEGREES

All students admitted in IIS (deemed to be University), are awarded degrees by IIS (deemed to be University)in its Convocation ceremony on successful completion of the courses / programmes opted by them.

### 35. MERIT POSITIONS

IIS (deemed to be University) declares merit positions from amongst the successful candidates who have obtained SGPA of more than 7.0 or overall grade 'A' (equivalent to I division) in the 1<sup>st</sup> semester and a CGPA of 7.0 or overall grade 'A' from II semester onwards and for the complete programme in the last semester/ annual examination, as the case may be. The candidate must also have passed all the prescribed papers in a course / programme in the first attempt. For this purpose **being absent in a paper is considered as an attempt availed**. The number of merit positions declared in different programmes is based on number of students in a programme. If the number is 50 and above, upto 10 merit positions are declared. If the number is less than 50 but more than 10, then upto 5 merit positions are declared. However, if the number is less than 10, upto 3 positions are declared, provided that number of positions to be declared does not exceed 50% of the total strength in the programme.

### 36. ATTENDANCE

For being eligible to appear in the Semester End/ Annual Examination, it is necessary for a candidate to have attended a minimum of 75% of the total classes held in that Semester / Year. There is a provision of duty leaves for participation in games and sports, NCC/NSS, cultural and other co-curricular / extra curricular or academic activities, so as to enable the participants to fulfill the minimum requirement of attendance.

### 37. RULES FOR PROMOTION

A candidate who has undergone a regular course of study in Semester I, fulfills the criteria of attendance and has taken Semester End Examination of a programme is eligible for promotion to Semester II, irrespective of the credits earned by her in Semester I. Similarly for promotion from any other odd semester to the next even semester (from III to IV or V to VI), the candidate should have fulfilled the criteria of attendance and should have taken the Semester End Examination of the respective odd semester.Promotion from odd to even semesters is however irrespective of credits earned by the candidate.

For promotion from an even semester to the next odd semester (i.e., from semester II to III or from semester IV to V), a candidate should have successfully completed all courses of study in semesters I & II or III & IV, respectively, as the case may be, and should have earned the required credits. However, a candidate who is not able to successfully complete all the courses of semesters I & II or semesters III & IV shall also be eligible for promotion to semester III, or semester V respectively, provided she passes in at least 50% of the courses of semesters I and II taken together (for promotion to semester III), and in semesters III and IV taken together (for promotion to semester V) and earns at least 50% of the total credits.

The credits earned in the extra curricular activities and campus activities are not considered for the purpose of promotion. However, for the award of degree, it is necessary that a candidate must qualify and earn minimum required credits in the extra curricular activities and campus activities, failing which the degree is not awarded. Similarly, credits earned in COSD programme are not considered for the purpose of promotion in the Degree programme.

### 38. PROVISION FOR UNSUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES

A candidate who is not eligible for promotion to the Semester III or V, as the case may be, (for not having earned the credits required for promotion from an odd semester to the next even semester) is allowed to appear in the subsequent examination as an **ex-student** so as to satisfy necessary conditions, qualify more papers and earn more credits in the immediately following year or in a Special Examination to be conducted by the university in July for students failing in practicals/ projects/ Internship/ Viva-voce and C.A. component and/ or not more than 50% of theory papers. After fulfilling the necessary criterion for promotion, such students are re-admitted and promoted to the next semester, as and when the relevant semester course is being run at the University.

### 39. DUE PAPERS

If a student does not pass in all the courses/papers prescribed in a semester, but earns the minimum credits required for promotion, she is promoted to the next semester and the papers in which she has failed are treated as "due papers". The candidate is required to appear in the due papers along with the papers of the next semester, provided that the examination of the due papers of an odd semester is held in an odd semester only and the examination of the due papers of an even semester is held in an even semester only.

In case of due papers, if a candidate fails in Semester End Examination only, the CA marks obtained by her in those papers in the earlier semester(s) are taken into account and the candidate is re-examined only in the

Semester End Examination. However, if a candidate also fails in CA, she is required to appear in CA of the due papers also.

In Career Oriented and Skill Development (Certificate / Diploma / Advanced Diploma) courses, a candidate failing in not more than 50% of the total papers (considering C.A. & S.E. as separate papers) may take the same as due papers in the immediately following year, else she will be required to appear in all the papers of theory and practical.

### 40. DUE PAPER EXAMS FOR FINAL YEAR STUDENTS

In the semester system, a candidate is allowed to take her due papers along with the papers of the next semester. Hence, there is no provision for any supplementary examination. However, a special opportunity is provided to the final year students to clear due papers. For final year students of U.G. and P.G. programmes special examination is held in the month of March for clearing the due papers of odd semesters (I, III and V) and in the month of July for clearing the due papers of even semesters (II, IV and VI) and the remaining due papers of Semesters I, III and V if any.

### 41. IMPROVEMENT

No provision for improvement of performance exists for Under graduate Honours / Professional and COSD programmes.

### 42. MAXIMUM TIME LIMIT

In a 6-Semester undergraduate professional programme, a candidate will have a maximum of 10 semesters (five academic years) for completion of the said programme, in case she fails to qualify all the courses in minimum prescribed time limit. However, the candidate will have to pay the prescribed registration fee for each of the additional semesters in which required to clear the left out courses or Due papers. Candidates unable to clear all the courses and earn minimum required credits within ten semesters (i.e., 5 years) due to some cogent reason may, however, be permitted to avail two more semesters by the Vice Chancellor, as a special case, to complete the programme. The students availing of the extended period will, however, be treated as private candidates and will not be entitled for ranking.

### 43. SHOWING ANSWER COPIES OF SEE /ANNUAL EXAMINATION

There is a provision of showing assessed answer copies of Semester End Examination/Annual Examination to the students of the University for which they are required to submit duly filled in application form along with the requisite fee within a period of 7 days of declaration of results.. The copy is shown to the applicant in the presence of a teacher. In case any answer is found un-assessed or ifthere is an error in totaling of marks, the examination cell puts up the case of the applicant before the committee constituted for the purpose. Necessary action on the recommendation of the committee is taken by the examination cell, after the approval is provided by the Vice Chancellor. There is no provision for revaluation of answer books. It should be noted that the University retains the Answer Scripts for only one year after declaration of the result. The University may hold the result of candidates who fail to earn minimum required credits in the activity component. In such cases answer copies can be shown only after declaration of result when the credits of activity are earned by the candidate.

### 44. WITHHOLDING OF RESULT

The university reserves the right to with hold the result of all those candidates who have not been enrolled in IIS (deemed to be University) for reasons such as non submission of Transfer Certificate, Migration Certificate, Copy of Aadhar Card and Marksheet of last qualifying examination.

### 45. PROVISIONS FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

The University has a special provision for the assessment and evaluation of persons with disabilities as per the guide lines issued by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, in this regard.

### 46. UNFAIR MEANS CASES

If a candidate is found using unfair means or indulging in disorderly conduct during the CA tests or Semester-End Examination or Annual Examination, a case of unfair means is registered against her and placed before the Unfair Means Adjudication Committee, constituted by the Academic Council. The committee examines the cases with the help of subject experts and recommends suitable action to the Vice-Chancellor for a final decision in the matter.

### **REGULATIONS (COMMON FOR CBCS BASED AND OTHER PROGRAMMES)**

### 47. FREESHIPS/SCHOLARSHIPS

The University offers freeships and scholarships to its students on need cum merit basis. The University may also recommend cases of eligible students for the award of scholarships under the various schemes of the State and Central Governments.

### 48. AWARDS AND MEDALS

Students excelling in academics, co-curricular & extracurricular activities are felicitated through various awards and scholarships instituted by the University. The University awards Gold Medals to the toppers of all UG and PG

Programmes, provided that the number of candidates in the Final year of the programme are five or more than five. For being eligible for the award of gold medal, a candidate must have obtained at least a First division in courses other than CBCS and or overall grade of **A** or CGPA of 7.00 in CBCS based programmes and she should have passed all the prescribed papers in the course in the first attempt. For this purpose being absent in a paper is considered as an attempt availed.

### 50. RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS

The University has instituted research fellowships, two per faculty, for full time research scholars registered for the Ph.D. degree, which are granted on need cum merit basis and performance in the interview conducted for the purpose.

### 51. STUDENT RESEARCH PROJECTS

In order to promote research orientation and acumen, the University sanctions minor research projects and provides seed money to UG and PG students across all the faculties and semesters. The student research projects are conducted under the supervision of faculty members and on successful completion of the project, the students are awarded Certificate of Appreciation.

Any candidate (who has been granted provisional / final admission to any course in the University) not desirous of continuing her admission after deposition of fees (laboratory fees, security deposit and conveyance charges etc.) will be entitled for refund of security deposit, only subject to notice / information having been given in writing by the candidate within 15 days from the date of deposition fees. Other amount of fees is non-refundable. The decision of the management in this regard shall be final and binding in all cases.
