**1.3 Learning-outcome based curriculum framework (LOCF) :**

The University has adopted a LOCF as part of which student-performance is monitored and assessed regularly. The learning outcomes are clearly spelt out in each programme-syllabi which go through minor updations every year and major revisions, once in five years.

Besides these, course objectives of each programme specified in the syllabus articulate the desired outcomes/goals of that course in terms of attributes, academic skills and learning goals.

Moreover, various extramural activities organized by the University through Guilds, Clubs, Societies, etc. aim at inculcating the following generic skills in the students:

- Soft skills such as Presentation skills, Communications skills, etc.
- Career Oriented Skills
- Entrepreneurship Skills
- Leadership skills
- Sense of patriotism

The outcome of these attributes is monitored through the following systems operative at the University level:

- Two credits per semester are awarded to those participating in one of the co-curricular activities viz. NCC/NSS/Sports/ cultural so as to inculcate in them a sense of patriotism, social responsibility and value of sports/games and cultural activities.
- Presentation, Linguistic and Entrepreneurship skills etc. form an integral part of the evaluative component of a number of courses and are hence monitored.
- Development of add on skills is monitored through the Continuous Assessment and annual examination pattern of Evaluation.
- Acquisition of Leadership Skills is evaluated on the basis of feedback obtained from students about the members of the student council that is taken and analyzed by the management every year.

As part of the assessment strategies, a system of Continuous Assessment (CA), exists in the University to assess the performance of the students. The University collects and analyses data on student learning outcomes in the following ways:

- Continuous assessment through ongoing evaluation of students' performance on various parameters
- Semester/Trimester End examinations
- Result analysis
- Feedback from all stakeholders
- Placement status

This data is used to identify barriers to learning and strategies are formulated to take appropriate measures, as under:

- The reports of the result analysis are provided to the faculty members for further improvement in their pedagogical practices to overcome the barriers to learning
- Arrange extra classes for slow learners

### 3. Information Communication Technology (ICT) being used by the Deemed to be University for effective teaching learning:

The university has wi-fi enabled campus to support online-learning for students and faculties. The University has introduced cloud based educational ERP system, namely Metacampus. The university has licensed software like Quark Express, WIEN2K, AutoCAD, Mathematica, Final CutPro (Audio and video editing), Adobe Premier Creative Cloud, SPSS version 20, Gaussian 16, MATLAB, Tally etc. which are embedded in the curriculum and are used in research. Besides these a number of open source software like R Programming, Python, etc are included in the curriculum.

The examination process from generation of the roll numbers to the preparation of the result is computer based. The University has devised in-house examination software which manages the whole process.

The University has developed its own software to conduct online exams in some of the papers

The Research Entrance Examination (RET) for the Ph.D. Candidates is also conducted in the form of Computer-based Exams.

The faculties are also adapting to conduct real-time classroom assessments with the help of educational mobile applications like Kahoot and Padlet to name a few.

The University has also subscribed plagiarism software–Turnitin which is used to check Plagiarism of the thesis of postgraduate dissertations and Ph.D.

Google Forms are used by students and research scholars for the purpose of data collection for dissertation and Ph.D thesis preparation.

The University has an intensive ICT enabled feedback collection mechanism, wherein, feedback on various aspects pertaining to the course, pedagogy and teachers is collected online from the students and other stakeholders

The University is facilitated through automated e- library, with subscriptions to e-journals like Springerlink, Questia, Delnet, etc.

The University Library has subscribed to Alice Oasis software

IISU Digital Library is an interface which has over 9000 full-text journals from quality QA publishing resources, over 80,000 audio-visual learning resources, over 1,20,000 full-text thesis, dissertations and course materials and more than 10,000 academic presentations.

The MOOCs has been integrated in the curricular structure as per the credit transfer scheme of UGC.

The University is a Remote Center of IIT Bombay outreach program.

The ICT resources like LCD, Computers, video clips, visualisers, smart boards, etc. form an integral part of the pedagogy.

The University has a Community Radio Station, 'CRS Radio 7' and a state of the art audio-visual studio which is used as practical laboratories to give students a hands on training and provide exposure to advanced learning.

- University has adopted Grading scheme to compute results.
- To ensure that all stakeholders are aware of the operative evaluation processes, the evaluation methods are communicated through University website, Academic Handbook, counseling sessions during admission process and through university ERP solution: Metacampus.
- Academic Records like Marksheets & Degree Certificates have been digitized and uploaded on the National Academic Depository. (NAD) for easy access to students
- Training workshops for faculty members are organized frequently on techniques of assessment and evaluation
  - Meritorious students are awarded in the Annual Convocation
- University has a system of redressing students' grievances pertaining to question papers through Grievance Redressal Cell

**10.1 Online with Details:**

Students' progression to higher education or the job market is one of the ultimate objectives of the University. All efforts are therefore made both at the Institutional and the Departmental level to track students' progress once they graduate from the University.

Offline activities for keeping track of students' progress:

- University maintains year wise database of the former students through excel spreadsheets, student directory and handbooks, updating the same regularly. This database is used for communication with the alumnae.
- Information regarding the progression of students is also maintained by telephonic conversations at departmental and central level.
- Besides the central database, each department maintains its alumnae database that is updated on regular basis to ensure the reliability of the data. The Departments' Boards of Studies also have alumnae as their members.
- The institution has a vibrant alumnae association "*Bandhar*" that strengthens the bond of understanding among the alumnae and the University. The Association holds executive council meetings regularly and alumnae meet cum get together every year to further strengthen the bond of the students with their alma mater. In session 2018-19, three executive council meetings were held with the main item in the agenda being strengthening of alumnae association. In session 2019-2020, two executive council meetings were organized.
- Rewind-Alumnae Newsletter is published biannually wherein the alumnae are encouraged to share their professional and personal achievements. This further helps the university to enrich its database.
- University also felicitates its outstanding alumnae which further inspires the alumnae to share their career progress.
- The detailed information regarding their personal and professional progress is also collected from students when they come to attend the convocation ceremony.
- Alumnae are invited by departments to deliver lectures/conduct demo sessions/organize workshops/judge cultural and academic events/as external examiners. In the last two years about 120 alumnae have been invited to the university in this context. Department of Fashion and Textiles invites its alumnae to conduct mentoring workshops for designing apparels for the Annual Fashion Show.
- Progression of the students is updated in the alumnae database during various Alumnae Meets and other events when the alumnae are invited to the university
- The University shares details of new and innovative courses offered by it with alumnae and encourage them to pursue them in order to enhance their skills in their respective fields. Department of Psychology encourages its students to take up summer internship programs in the Career Guidance and Counseling Cell to further enhance their skills.
- Placement Cell of the University is also instrumental in gathering progression of students who are placed. Internship and Placement data is further enriched through Letters of Recommendation and No Objection Certificates.
- The IISU also runs an IISU preparatory centre for the alumnae and current students and prepares them for competitive exams such as the civil services, CAT, NET, UPSC, RPSC and other exams- In the last two years 27students have successfully qualified one or the other exam 2018-2019 around 41; 2019-2020 around 37.

**10.2 Offline with Details:**

The university also remains connected with the students through online mechanisms and social media to track their progression both in terms of higher education and placement. Online activities for keeping track of students' progress after course completion are as follows:
