Prof. N.D. Mathur suggested that the draft power point should be taken as a guide and freedom should be given to the departments so that the uniqueness is maintained in the presentation of each department.

The Chairperson Prof. T. N. Mathur assured him that necessary changes will be made accordingly.

Members took note of the action taken on various decisions of the Cell and found them satisfactory. After detailed deliberations, it was resolved that the report be approved.

ITEM III TO REPORT ABOUT THE LOCF WORKSHOP ORGANIZED FOR IMPROVEMENT OF LEARNING OUTCOMES

Members were apprised that IQAC and FDP committee of the University organized a capacity building workshop on Learning Outcome-Based Curricular Framework (LOCF) in collaboration with 'Active Learning Workshops' in order to train faculty members in designing Learning Outcome based Curriculum. The



workshop was organized in two phases, first on 16-17 April and second on 9-10 June 2021. The workshop was attended by 190 faculty members of the University. The objective of the workshop was to equip the faculty members in understanding the Outcome Based Education (OBE), process of Curriculum Design along with Teaching Learning methods and assessment tools focusing on achieving learning outcomes.

The resource persons for the workshop were Dr. Sameer Sahasrabuddhe, Director, Educational Multimedia Research Centre, Pune; Dr. Vinay Kulkarni, Associate Professor and NBA Institute Coordinator, DY Patil College of Engineering, Akurdi, Pune and Dr. Ajita Deshmukh, Assistant Professor, MIT ADT University, Pune.

The workshop helped the participants in enhancing their understanding of Programme Outcomes, Programme Specific Outcomes and Course Outcomes.

A total of 117 assignments on POs and COs were submitted by the participating Faculty members at the end of phase 1, which were evaluated and reviewed in phase 2 by the team of Active Learning Workshops.

The feedback collected from participants showed that the workshop /FDP was successful in terms of the objectives with which it was designed and conducted. (Annexure-II).

The members appreciated the efforts of IQAC and FDP committee. Prof. N.D. Mathur enquired about the implementation of the learnings of the workshop in framing of POs, PSOs and COs of the programmes offered by the University. In response, he was informed that all the faculty members have now been advised to revisit and revise the POs, PSOs and COs of their respective programmes, based on the new learning.

ITEM IV TO SHARE THE REPORTS OF THE FEEDBACK MONITORING COMMITTEE

The Feedback Monitoring Committee collects the following feedbacks annually:

- a) University Faculty Feedback (Odd and Even Semester)
- b) Parents' Feedback
- c) Alumni Feedback

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- d) Departmental Faculty Feedback (Paper-wise)
- e) Course Completion Feedback (Before Continuous Assessment and Semester End)
- f) Curricular Feedback

The following feedbacks have been collected and analyzed for the session 2020-21:

- Curricular Feedback
- Departmental Faculty Feedback (Paper-wise)
- Course Completion Feedback

Reports on the same were placed before the committee (**Annexure-III**) for perusal of members.

Members were informed that the preparation of reports for the other feedbacks is in process. The external expert Prof. N. D. Mathur inquired about the number of students involved in the feedback, in response Nodal Officer of the Committee the Dr. Ruchi Nanda informed that about 60% students had given feedback through google form.

The members noted and provided their unanimous approval for the feedback system adopted by the University. It was suggested that on the basis of feedbacks, appropriate action should be taken wherever required.

ITEM V TO REPORT THE PROGRESS OF ALL IISU JOURNALS AND SUGGESTIONS FOR INDEXING IN DIFFERENT DATABASES

IQAC coordinator informed the members that the University publishes four double blind in-house peer-reviewed journals, namely, Journal of Arts (JOA), Journal of Social Sciences (JOSS), Journal of Commerce and Management (JCM) and Journal of Science and Technology (JOST). Further, the convenors of the journals were invited to apprise the members about the progress of their respective journals.

 Dr. Rimika Singhvi informed that Journal of Arts (JOA) is multidisciplinary in nature and have been publishing regularly since 2012 on an annual (July) basis and since 2020 has gone bi-annual (July and December). The journal



publishes research papers, articles, monographs, author interviews, book and film reviews, position papers, etc. It is listed with UGC-CARE since June 2019 and has been publishing without any gap. Till date 9 volumes have been published with 2 issues of volume 9 being the latest. Work is in progress on issue 1 of volume 10.

- Dr. Vandana informed that Journal of Social Sciences (JOSS) is being published regularly since 2012. Research articles, comments/research notes, review articles and Book reviews from social sciences are considered for publication in the journal. It was a UGC CARE listed till 2019, after which it was removed from the CARE list. The team of the journal ismaking all efforts to get the journal listed again in UGC-CARE.
- Dr. Mahima Rai informed that Journal of Commerce and Management (JCM) is an annual peer reviewed journal which is being published since the year 2012.Till date, 9 volumes have been published and publication of volume 10 is in process.
- Pr. Charu Sharma informed the members that Journal of Science and Technology (JOST) is being published annually since 2012. Each manuscript is reviewed by an internal reviewer and an external expert. Suggestions are incorporated by authors and manuscript are finally checked by editorial committee members to ensure that all suggested changes have been made and manuscript follows journal format. Plagiarism content of each article is checked as well. The composing work for back volumes 7, 8, and current volume 9 is in progress. Till date 22 articles have been finalized for publication. 70% of the papers have been composed, proofs have been mailed to authors for final check. 30% of the papers are in the process of composing. It is expected that the above said three volumes of the journal will be published by the end of July 2021. She also informed that the team had applied in December 2020 to UGC-CARE list but so far it has not been included. Therefore, they will make efforts for the same again in the forthcoming session.

Committee members noted the problems of the journals and recommended for providing necessary secretariat facilities for ensuring regular publication of



these journals. Also, it was observed that efforts be made for indexing of these journals in reputed databases. Once indexed in several databases, it will be easier to get them included in the UGC-CARE.

ITEM VI TO REVIEW THE PROGRESS OF ALUMNAE ASSOCIATION 'BANDHAN'

Dr. Shelja Juneja, Nodal Officer, ICG-IISU Alumnae Association, 'Bandhan' apprised the members that the Alumnae Association of the University got registered as ICG-IISU Alumnae Association —Bandhan on 29th September 2020 under the Companies Act 2013 although it has been there since the inception of the institution. Every year the Association holds 3 executive council meetings and one general body meeting besides some other interactive and fun filled activities. In the session 2020-21, the association organized a few online activities. One major event organized was the annual alumnae meet on 17th April, 2021 with 220 participants. The university alumnae interact with current students through guest lectures/panel discussions/ seminars to guide them on various professional avenues available. A webinar was organized where in the first batch alumna was invited to motivate and interact with the current students. Online talk series were also organized in collaboration with theatrical society of the University. The report on the activities of the association during session 2020-21 was placed before the committee (**Annexure-IV**) for perusal of the members.

Prof. N.D. Mathur suggested that Alumnae contribution should increase for getting NIRF ranking and more webinar should be organized for Alumnae to increase faculty-alumnae-students interaction. His suggestions were noted. The Vice Chancellor assured the members for more effective role of alumnae in development of the University in the coming session.

TO INFORM THE MEMBERS ABOUT THE SUBSCRIPTION OF MEMBERSHIPS OF DIFFERENT ORGANIZATIONS TO ENHANCE THE QUALITY OF RESEARCH AND LEARNING OF e-TOOLS AND TECHNIQUES Members were informed that with the initiatives of IQAC, the University has subscribed to the membership of 'Researgence' developed by CIntelligence

Dr.

Services Private Limited, Chennai for maintaining the research profiles of the faculty, departments and the University. The online platform captures all publications of each researcher in online indexed databases. Moreover, the platform has a repository of 26,372 journals categorized into Science, Engineering, Management and Medicine that assists faculty in selecting the best indexed journals for publishing their research. The Researgence team complies a monthly bulletin of the research profile of IIS University. The bulletin for the month of May 2021 was shared with the members. The highlights of the bulletin were:

- The total University publications were 1374.
- Publications in the year 2021 till 31st May is 36 among which 10 were indexed in Scopus or Web of Science.
- The total citations increased from 1881 (April) to 1929 (May) i.e. 48 citations were added in one month.
- o The average impact factor was 1.67.
- Though till 31st May, the University has 36 publications, according to the trends, it is estimated that the total publications at the end of 2021 is expected to touch 86.

Prof. N.D. Mathur suggested that Q level of the papers in Scopus should also be mentioned.

Prof. Vijay Singh Rathore informed the members that the University has also tied-up with DigitalEd, a cloud-based software company for a digital learning platform-Mobius for creating and deploying interactive teaching and assessment for teachers and students. Prof. N.D. Mathur enquired whether the platform was catering to Blended learning or Hybrid learning. In response, Prof. Singh informed that Mobius is a learning platform operative in hybrid mode.

Members were also apprised about the subscription of membership of ICT Academy, to train the higher education teachers and students. Dr. Anubha Jain informed the members that ICT Academy is an initiative of the Government of India in collaboration with the state Governments and Industries. It helps its member higher educational institutions through Faculty Development, Training



Programs, Skill Development Initiatives, Research, Industry-Institute Interaction, Nurturing Innovation etc.

A total of 16 online training/ online FDPs have been conducted from which 39 faculty members and 481 students have been benefited. The details of the activities are as follows:



 - 1. Kindly rate your level of knowledge about the topics covered in LOCF workshop before attending the workshop.



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
- 95% of the participants reported that their knowledge level about the topics covered in LOCF workshop/FDP after attending it has become very high/high as compared to before the workshop.


- 98.3% of the participants expressed that they feel highly competent/competent enough to frame outcome-based curriculum after attending this workshop /FDP.

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IIS (Deemed to be University), Jaipur Feedback Monitoring Cell Curricular Feedback (2020-21)

The curriculum feedback has been taken from the students of different classes and programs. The data was collected and analysed. The highlights of the analysis are presented here:

Positive features

 Most of the courses have been found to be job oriented, interesting and framed to meet today's market demand.

Constructive feedback

- Students of Physics suggested making paper more subjective with deep understanding of concepts and the syllabus of Condensed Matter Physics should be shorter.
- Students of Mathematics, B.Ed., Geography suggested reducing the assignment and activity.
- Students of Geography suggested use of animated videos and regular updates about geographical news and happenings world over must be provided.
- Students of Computer Science and IT suggested that subjects like AI and VFX should also be included.
- Students of Fashion & Textiles suggested that software's should be taught according to industry demand.
- Students of Fashion and Textiles, Home Science, Journalism and Mass Communication,
 Public Administration, Sociology suggested organization of more industrial/field visits in the department.
- Suggestions were received from undergraduate students of Chemistry that teachers need to take more care of average and below average students.
- Suggestions were received from students of Home Science, Journalism and Mass Communication, Psychology, Statistics, Business Studies, Tourism and ABM to organize more workshops/ demonstrations/ seminars/ Guest Lectures and field visits.

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- Students of Economics, Public Administration, Fashion & Textiles, Psychology, Mass communication, Tourism, HRM, ABM, ATG, Financial Studies and Public Administration suggested the need for more practical approach in teaching.
- Students of English suggested that emphasis should be given on workshops, seminar and more interactive sessions should be conducted to improve the spoken skills of students.
- Students of German suggested that more class activities should be there to develop interest in the students.
- Suggestions were received from students of Home Science that curriculum can be
 enriched by incorporating more practical hands-on experience to the students where they
 can explore and learn more about their field of nutrition and human development.
 Furthermore, the teaching and learning especially in foods and nutrition should be more
 in line with cognitive requirements which can be ensured by developing such skills via
 enriching curriculum
- Students of Business studies suggested to incorporate case studies in their curriculum.
- Students of MBA (Finance) suggested to add live sessions related to Indian Stock Market.

Departmental Faculty Feedback (Paper-wise) (2020-21)

The subject-wise feedback has been taken from the students of different classes and programs. The data was collected and analysed by the head and submitted to Feedback Monitoring Cell for the session 2020-21. The outcome of the feedback is analyzed at discipline level and accordingly action is taken. Action taken reports are available in the respective disciplines.

Course Completion Feedback (2020-21)

The course completion feedback for both CA and sem-end have been taken from the heads of the various disciplines. The highlights of the analysis are presented here:

- All the Disciplines of the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences; Disciplines of the Faculty of Commerce and Management and Disciplines of the Faculty of Science had completed their respective syllabus in the given duration of time.
- Teachers in some of the disciplines took extra/remedial and revision classes for the students to discuss their problems related to the respective subjects. They conducted online quizzes,

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presentations and organized guest lectures to interact with the students and keep them engaged.



Overall Report of the activity: IISU Theatrical Society, COSD Theatre studies, ICG-IISU Alumnae Association - Bandhan and Rotary Club Jaipur- Gurukul organized 4 days talk series on Theatre. This talk session was the Final session of this series started with the welcome note by Ms. Aditi Khandelwal and further moderated by Ms.Divya Bhomia, Alumni of IISU. Ms.Babita Madaan is a children theatre facilitator, Theatre teacher, Theatre manager and Actress. After the Introduction, Ms. Divya started moderating the session, she herself was curious to know 25 years of Theatre so are the students. Ms.Babita Madaan shared that she was in a dance group and she didn't know about theatre and once she got an offer to work with a senior eminent theatre director of Rajasthan, Late Mr. S.Vasudev singh ji and she immediately said yes and that's how her Voyage in theatre started. This was the time of theatre when there were less females in this domain but Ms.Babita Madaan made her place in Theatre and tried to make safe spaces for other girls in art. At this point of conversation she took some time to appreciate IISU for having an active theatrical society and Certificate and Diploma courses in theatre for girls.

She said IISU has been doing an amazing work to inspire girls. Further she continued by saying that earlier it was difficult to think of financial stability in Theatre but Now there are so many repertory, professional theatre groups where one can work full time. She nearly cried while sharing her Journey with the students. She told students how theatre helps in understanding emotions, understanding life situations and our own reactions. When Ms. Divya asked her about the changing scenario of theatre, she said earlier they didn't have technology and now everything that we want to know about world theatre is just one click away. At the end there were a Q&A session in which students asked their questions to Ms. Babita Madaan and She replied each one of them patiently. Ms. Aditi Khandelwal said Thanks to Ms. Babita Madaan for sharing her personal experiences with students.

Outcome: Theatre has changed a lot in all these years but the essence is still same, it is important to learn and walk with changing scenario but the ultimate objective of art is same to help in expression and to make better society.

Objective of the Talk: How crucial is the role of text & reading in performing? What career opportunities theatre provides us with and how does one find their centre in the world that's constantly changing, while pursuing something as fickle and uncertain as theatre. This particular session was designed to answer

these questions.

Overall Report of the activity: IISU Theatrical Society, COSD Theatre studies, ICG-IISU Alumnae Association - Bandhan and Rotary Club Jaipur-Gurukul are organising a talk series on Theatre. This talk session was the fifth session overall in this series and first of the year 2021. The session started with the welcome note delievered by Dr. Aditi R.Khandelwal and was further moderated by Ms Jyoti Sharma, an Alumni of IISU and President-The IISU Theatrical Society 2017-18. She introduced Mr. Kuljeet Singh to the audience. An actor, director, producer, professor, curator, sir is also the founder and creative director of Atelier Theatre (2004), a Delhi based Theatre company. His vast experience of performance includes several theatre productions under the direction of M.K. Raina, Avtar Sahni, Surendra Sharma, Roysten Abel, Anna-Helena McLean and V.K. Sharma. He has also acted in Shonali Bose's National Award winning film Amu and Margarita With A Straw, Imtiaz Ali's Rockstar and Sharad Nigam's Interval. He has directed over a dozen productions for college students and more than 50 theatre plays for different schools in Delhi, Rajasthan, Punjab and Himachal Pradesh. His flagship programme-LEARNING THROUGH THEATRE is extremely popular in various schools.

Known for his restrained performance in films like *Margarita With A Straw* and *Amu*, his recent works include Sunit Sinha's *Ranj* and Amazon Prime's Web series *Breathe-2*, directed by Mayank Sharma. His upcoming film is *Udham*, directed by Shoojit Sircar.

After the introduction Ms Jyoti asked him about how has his journey through the years been, donning multiple hats and such vivid roles. He shared how he hails from a family with no background in theatre and It was only as a student at the Delhi University, where he was pursuing Bachelor of Arts in English Literature, that his journey with theatre started. One of his professors, Prof. Zafar Malik encouraged him to join the university theatre team backstage. And it was there that he "fell in love with the smell of the stage, the dark of the auditorium and

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the silence in the backstage", as he quotes. Singh was offered professorship at the university in 2007, soon after his graduation and he kept doing theatre alongside teaching till 2017. Though he was constantly advised against leaving a full time, secure job of professorship, he decided to take the leap of faith and he left teaching and dedicated himself full time to theatre and performing arts.

Mr. Singh also spoke about the endless creative channels and career options that theatre provides today. He shared his personal and professional experiences from the pandemic, especially how his theatre group's travelling and performing plans were stalled yet personally how he found so much time to read, reflect and watch movies he couldn't before. He spoke about how being away from stage for so long and returning back just now could make the young artists feel insecure but they need to combat their every apprehension with the right attitude and confidence.

Ms. Vritika Dhabhai, an alumna of the IISU and an active member of the IISU Theatrical Society then took over the session and asked him about his favourite texts, writers and the role of reading in performing. Mr. Singh spoke at length how instrumental reading is in theatre and shared his list of favourite books and writers. Singh also gave an account of his association with the IISU family that dates long back, delighted over the fact that students here are provided with formal training in theatre.

At the end there was a Q&A session in which students asked their questions to Mr. Kuljeet and He answered them with his great zeal and insight.

At the end, the Thank-you note was delivered by Dr. Aditi R. Khandelwal. Everyone thanked Mr. Kuljeet Singh, Dr. Aditi and the entire management for organising the session.

Outcome - Theatre is not just about acting. Rather It's a continuous journey of learning, evolving and self-reflection. As far as the role of text is questioned with respect to performance, it is of utmost importance. It helps you build not just the characters but a perception, an understanding too. And probably that's what provides us theatre artists with an edge over the non-theatre actors in cinema.
